Present were Chairman, Matt Young, Vice Chairman, Allen Beckett, and Supervisors Dan Golliday. Secretary, Joyce Shindledecker, Police Chief of Liberty, Matt Harvey, Solicitor, Linus Fenicle, Engineer/SEO, Dean Shultz, Road Superintendent and road laborer, Ed and Mike Wenschhof, respectively, and Emergency Coordinator, Don Wills were also present. Public in attendance were Darlene & Walter Stone, Nancy Bushey, K.C. & Kathy

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Meadows, Jack Powell, Steve, Cecilia and Brook Gregory, C.W. Koontz, Bob Jackson, Luxie Althoff, Duke Martin and Tom Wolf. Also present were Attorneys Todd King and

Matt Young called the regular meeting together and announced an executive session was held prior to the regular meeting to discuss matters in litigation.

Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the minutes of the November 7, 2012 meeting, 3-0

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the financial report from November 1-December 31, 2012, 3-0

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Police Report-Matt Harvey gave the report with Freedom patrol hrs 59.2, Freedom on call hr 272, Freedom incident hrs 37.75, Call outs 4, Patrol Check 205, Vehicles stopped 14, Traffic citations/Arrests 12, warning notes 3. A full police report is available upon request.

Road Report-Joyce submitted the road report written by Ed Wenschhof-Ed & Mike set up the voting booths, salt was delivered from International Salt, and front tires were installed on the tractor by Mar-Bar Tire. Eight (8) new 35 mph road signs with posts were installed on Middle Creek Road; a battery was installed in Dodge Truck by Quality tire. Ed filled out forms for Scott Road ditch clearing and sent to Adams County Conservation District who will forward them to DEP. Leaves and trash pickup work was done along township roads and a tree was cleaned up on Natural Dam Road. Ed checked out a driveway for tractor trailer parking at 904 Middle Creek Road. Ed will discuss safety

Matt announced that the International Truck advertised to be sold for a minimum bid of 4,000 at Wolf's Auction had been sold for 4,100 less selling fees. Also he told the public the new truck maybe delivered before the end of the year. Allen Beckett made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the road report. 3-0

2013 Budget Approval. The 2013 budget had been advertised and was posted at the

township for review. The main expenses for 2013 are the Police Contract for \$42,000 (ends 12/31/2013), \$70,000 for road improvements, and \$43,480.06 for the new truck installment payment. A resolution was written for no tax increase. Year end funds for 2013 will be \$369,000.00 if the budget requires no new expenses. A motion was made by Matt Young and to second by Allen Beckett to approve the budget and resolution 12-12-2012 with no tax increase. Tax millage is .4558 was .3 mill in 2012.

Audit 2012- a motion was made by Matt Young and a second by Dan Golliday to advertise to appoint Joyce Lockwood of Lockwood business Support at the 2013 reorganizational meeting to perform the 2012 audit. 3-0

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Mason Dixon Country Club-The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors has been presented with the final sewage module on 12-12-2012. Linus Fenicle, Dean Shultz of Gettysburg Engineering and William Hill, Engineer have been working with Solicitor Timothy Weston and MDCC for the past year on the sewage module. Linus Fenicle announced that he and Gettysburg Engineering's Dean Shultz will conduct a check list in the next ten days to see that everything is included in the module. Linus stated that the clock starts today for the 60 day review of the Supervisors and the Planning Commission (if they wish to review), but with the holidays he would request an extension through the March 13, 2013 meeting for review.

Blue/Ray Alliance proposed reenactment 2013-K. C. Meadows expressed his thanks to Dean Shultz and Matt Harvey for working diligently with the event organizers to bring their plan along as far as the plan has come today. He stated that the submission months ago was "like a comic book" with regard to their new submission on 12/9/2012. K.C. Meadows stated that the event organizers are looking for "a letter on intent" or a special meeting on December 21, 2012 to grant permits in order to advertise their event and have re-enactors submitting their applications for the June 26-30, 2013 proposed event at the Nancy Bushey Farm, 1495 Pumping Station Road, Gettysburg, Pa. Mr. Meadows stated that Penn Dot Permits require the Board to at least give contingent approval. Dean Shultz added that another issue is agreements with landowners on parking. He stated that the Baddicks of 804 Cunningham Road have not signed on as of today. Temporary driveway locations must be approved by Penn dot on State Roads. Also he mentioned the amusement tax and the parking. K.C. Meadows stated that the 7.00 fee and 3.00 parking fee will be put together for an admission fee of 10.00. Without charging parking as the spectators arrive will speed up the parking process. Dean asked about the amusement tax whether it is on admission, re-enactor admission fees Etc. Joyce Stated that the Gettysburg 150th had paid out on the last event for both. Dean stated there should be a resolution with the amusement tax. Dean also said that within 90 days of the event there should be contracts with all suppliers, everything should be updated on how the even organizers propose to do this. He stated that great progress has been made since the first meeting. He is very close to recommending to the Board

Emergency Management Coordinator-Don Wills has given his resignation to the Board to retire as Coordinator on 12/31/2012. Allen Beckett has been working with Don on obtaining the necessary paper work to become the coordinator. A background check is required and Don's letter of resignation along with Allen's application. Matt Young stated that all this will be done at the January 7, 2013 re-organizational meeting. Matt voung made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to hold the re-organizational meeting at 7:00 p.m. immediately followed by the regular supervisors meeting. There will be no meeting on Wednesday January 9, 2013.

Cecilia Gregory-Cecilia Gregory had contacted Joyce a few weeks ago to be put on tonight's agenda. The Gregory's had received a written letter from Gettysburg Engineering's Dean Shultz on November 6, 2012. The letter explained that the Gregory's are in the process of purchasing the Jack Koontz property at 4450 Emmitsburg Road and formerly K & M Motors. The letter in the 3rd to the last paragraph states that the business on the property is in violation of the Townships Ordinances and you must cease and desist this use until you have secured the necessary approval and permits to use the property as a trucking terminal type of use and for your crane business. Mr. Shultz asked the Gregory's to make application for a Zoning Hearing. Mrs. Gregory had contacted Joyce for the application but has not followed up with that because of some

The courts have not yet allowed the purchase of the property but this decision may be handed down in a matter of days. Attorney Todd King, of Campbell and White, and Attorney Samuel Teeter representing Modern Transportation (leasing the property) attended the meeting to clarify their client's intentions. After much discussion of the parking of vehicles on the East Side, what is to transpire on the West Side of the property and what is going on at the present, there was agreement that the Gregory's will file application to the zoning hearing board after they have purchased the property. There will also be a land development plan for the West Side to incorporate everything that will be conducted on that part of the property. The township will not formally ask for the cease and desist at this time. But SEO Dean Shultz is requiring that the sewage problem for an existing mobile home be immediately addressed. The Gregory's are willing to work with the township officials, Supervisors and Zoning Boards to bring there business to the township Zoning and Subdivision Ordinance requirements.

Stormwater Management Ordinance-

On January 27, 2012 the County required each township to adopt a stormwater management ordinance by July 25, 2012. Dean Shultz and the Supervisors have been working on the ordinance, but as of July 11, 2012 dean had forwarded a draft ordinance to solicitor Linus Fenicle for review. Linus stated he wanted the Board to review the draft plan and get back to him by August meeting on any changes, additions, etc. The ordinance will be ready for adoption at the September 12, 2012 meeting. There was discussion of who would enforce the ordinance. Matt stated that that should be a part of the ordinance.

Truck-Joyce stated that the truck was open for discussion-

The truck "to be looked at" from last month was sold prior to any inspection. The supervisors had previously voted 2-1 to purchase a new truck if this truck did not work out.. There was discussion to meet with a piggyback vendor in order to discuss whether to finance the truck or buy it with cash, 80,000 from State funds set aside for equipment, and the remainder out of the CD or reserve general funds. Matt made a motion to buy a new 2013 truck on a piggyback program. Dan made a second to the motion. 2-1 Allen abstained.

Reassessment remaining funds- The Board has been asking for legal advice and has previously discussed the remaining funds in the reassessment fund. Linus Fenicle had drafted a letter to Paul Kellett asking why he thought the remaining funds should go to him alone, when so many people had given donations to the lawsuit. Paul explained he did not answer the letter as Linus would be paid out of the remaining funds for the letter response being reviewed by attorney Fenicle.

Paul Kellett explained that 7,000.00 of his own money were given by check # 2814 of November 17, 2010 written on the memo line escrow reassessment to Matt Battersby Law Office. Paul went on to say that Matt Battersby was told by Paul to hold this money and only use the money for part of the 10,000 legal fee (not to be succeeded) if donations did not come in to cover his legal costs. Battersby used money from Paul's check 7,000.00 before billing the township any of the 10,000.00. Paul stated that the minutes of November 10, 2012 reflected this exact request to Battersby. Paul also recalled that Joyce asked him why Battersby used his escrow money first. At the time, Paul did not think this would be an issue. But this now has become a major issue to the township. Dan Golliday expressed that what may keep any of the others (who donated money) from coming to the township and protesting (if Paul was given the entire amount left in the fund) and they didn't receive any money. Linus Fenicle had the same thoughts. Paul spoke that if he didn't receive the money the township would have a lawsuit.

Joyce asked why the people who came to the township in support of Paul asking the township to back the lawsuit were not coming to the township in support of Paul receiving the remaining money?

Paul stated he had asked them to come (in support in the beginning).

The funds on hand are now at \$5435.78 including the outstanding invoice of 91.00 to Reager & Adler for attorney fees. Joyce added that the legal bills from June were not received as of today. Linus stated they were not very much. After a round of discussion back and forth, Paul Kellett agreed to sign a document to be prepared by Linus Fenicle to release the township from any further liability/expenses.

Joyce announced that a Council of Government (COG) Convention would be held on Sept 7-9 at the Wyndam in Gettysburg. Dan Golliday is a member of the COG, she gave him the information.

AC Collaboration Committee-An email asked a few questions of the Board-the Board declined answering the questions.

Highland Acres-The Mylar approved for the Highland Acres (James Bigham subdivision) lots in Highland and the one lot in Freedom approved in 2008 was never recorded. Linus stated that Highland would need to address any subdivision/zoning changes on the Highland side first, then Freedom could resign the mylars. Highland will address the mylars next month.

EM coordinator-With Don Wills resigning at the end of 2012 -last month's meeting) the Board is looking for a new Coordinator. Deputy Herb Milligan has not been certified as of yet. Certification is the taking of an online test of about 25 questions. Herb is undecided (according to Don Wills) whether he is going to take the test or not. Allen Beckett had expressed interest in the Coordinator position at the last meeting. Matt Young stated that he wants someone in place to take over the position when Don retires in December and he does not want it. He had done the job years ago and is not up to the
