**Secretary Report-
Natural Dam Road**

Solicitor Linus Fenicle has prepared an agreement with Randy and Amy Naill and Jenny Cullison of Natural Dam Road concerning the cul-d-sac situation on Natural Dam Road. Linus has heard from Naill's attorney Chris Restak that they are in agreement. Jenny Cullison has asked for more time due to the recent death of her father, Robert Cullison. Matt asked about the public walking to the creek-that is understood in the agreement, there will be no parking on the road, but walking will be permitted. The road will not be vacated.

Gregory Land Development Plan and Storm Water Management Plan-The plan was reviewed by Gettysburg Engineer's Dean Shultz and the Adams County Planning Commissioners. There were numerous comments listed from Dean and several from the County to be addressed. Engineer Jack Powell and Steven and Cecilia Gregory upon receiving the comments asked the Board in a memo of March 10, 2014 for a 60 day extension. The Board granted an extension until May 15, 2014 by a motion by Allen Beckett and a second by Matt Young. 2-0

5th Annual Gettysburg National Century Baseball Festival July 19 and 20-Dean had prepared comments in a letter of February 12, 2014 to the Board. Dean and Brand Briggs had reviewed the letter. Matt Young, by motion, with a second by Allen Beckett, granted a variance on traffic control (suggested approval from Brand Briggs) and gave conditional approval that all comments of a prepared letter by Dean Shultz need be addressed and a revised plan be submitted. 2-0

Gettysburg Anniversary Committee-reenactment July 3-5- As suggested at last month's meeting, Dean Shultz met with coordinator James Fox and Brand Briggs. Dean and Brand had given a rough draft to Jim to make revisions on the plan submitted. Dean had not heard from Jim since that day. Jim is to prepare revisions and correct the books. George Lomas seemed clueless on any of these revisions. Allen Beckett was satisfied with this and stated to Dean that these were minor corrections? Dean did not agree-saying it is the way they are looked upon. The insurance policy will be forwarded closer to the event stated George Lomas. This policy should include the township, its agents and employees. Dean stated that the plan had some inconsistencies as to which side of the road for parking, some pages from other reenactments, etc. No decision was given by the Board.

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James Hobbs revised parking plan-Joyce had received a revised parking plan and SWM plan just today March 12, 2014 from Engineer Jack Powell. Dean had also received the plan and has just started the review. Rather his comments would be available for the April 9, 2014 meeting remains to be determined by his schedule. The millings are a concern for the parking area. Matt Young stated there our complaints from residents on the mud on the road and the dust from the area.—Matt-the road is a mess. Matt does not think millings will work.

Cellco/Verizon Land Development Plan has been submitted and Linus Fenicle has prepared the agreement for the tower removal. The planning commission board will review the plan at their April 2, 2014 meeting at 7:00 at the township building.

American Odyssey Relay Race-The township officials have acknowledged the event will be held again on April 25-26.

Annual MS Bike Ride-The township officials have acknowledged the event will be held again on July 26-27, 2014.

Bank account-Joyce visited the bank on changing the reserve account to an escrow account. She will make the necessary money transfer.




Emergency Management Update-Joyce received the forms to complete the two year update. Allen Beckett as his first year as coordinator would like time to go over the paper work. Matt and Joyce stated the paper work was standard-to update the booklet.

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors April 9, 2014 meeting

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors' April 9, 2014 meeting was held at the township building at 8:00 p.m.

Present were Chairman Matt Young and Vice Chairman Dan Golliday. Allen Beckett was unable to attend. Present also was Secretary Joyce Shindlecker, Liberty Police Chief Brand Briggs, solicitor, Linus Fenicle and Whitney Shifflett, president of the Greenmount Fire Company. Public in attendance were Tom Wolf, Brian Shaub, James Strong, Randy Phiel, Kenneth Farrell, George Lomas, Jim Fox, and Daryl and Sherrin Poland.

Matt Young brought the meeting to order.

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the minutes of March 12, 2014. 2-0

Dan Golliday made the motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the financial report with a balance of all accounts \$304,981.92. 2-0

Public Comment-None

Police Report-Brand Briggs gave the following: Total hours worked 334.5, Freedom Twp patrol 41.5 hrs, Freedom on call 339.5 hrs, Freedom Twp incidents 11.75 hrs Freedom patrol Checks 107, vehicles stopped 12, traffic citation/arrests 5, warning notices 6. Brand reported that their force now has 3 AED units and now all units in the county are equipped. Brand also mentioned to the public in attendance that there have been a few burglaries in the township. Also there is continuing road construction on the south bound side of 15 which will affect traffic in the ongoing months. Matt complimented the new spread sheet of the traffic detail enforcement log.

Road Report-Ed Wenschhof had submitted the following: Plow and antiskid roads-two plowable snows of app 2" each this month. Cold patch repair of some potholes and misc areas. Cleanup along roads-limbs, trash and plowed up sod, misc maintenance and other shop work, PA one calls washed off trucks, etc. Ed met with Gary Tipton from Penn Dot and Randy from Hammaker East concerning last August's sealcoat work on Middle Creek Road,

Randy of Hammaker East says they will re-do the job. Ed noted in his report the question if a road inspection could be rescheduled that had been tentatively set for March 19, 2014. There was a total of 84 hours of road and shop work for the month. 2-0
No comment on road inspection.

Greenmount Fire Company Report-Joyce read Brad Poland's emailed report- 5 calls for the month consisting of 3 provided mutual aids and one received. A breakdown 2

transfer, 1 barn fire, 1 automatic alarm, one request for fire police. Of those mentioned 2 Frederick County, 1 Freedom, 1 Cumberland and 1 Bonneauville Boro.

Secretary Report-

Natural Dam Road-Linus Fenicle reported that Randy and Amy Naill had signed the agreement that Linus has prepared. Linus is still waiting for response from Ms. Jenny Cullison. Linus offered to write Ms. Cullison. The Board agreed.

5th Annual Gettysburg National Century Baseball Festival-Joyce has received the updated copies which update the plan (pages) 5.3, 12.1 and 19. But in reviewing the document Joyce notice several pages missing (13.2, 15, 16, 17, and 18) that were in the original plan submitted. She said she called the coordinator and he was sending a new updated plan with all pages to Dean at Gettysburg Engineering and two new copies of the plan to the township. Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the event based on the omitted pages showing up to Dean. 2-0
Date of Event: July 19 and July 20

Gettysburg Anniversary Committee-Jim Fox had met with Gettysburg Engineering's Dean Shultz to review recommendations from Dean on this years' event. Per phone call to Joyce, Dean was satisfied with the plan as long as Linus reviews the insurance, the amusement tax was in place, and the escrow of \$3000.00 check was to the township. Joyce stated that the insurance named the township. The amusement tax in the past had been reported monthly and the township has been given the escrow amount. Jim stated the EMS contract has now been signed and Jim will be sending a PDF file to the township and EM director Allen Beckett. Dan made the motion with a second by Matt to approve the plan contingent that Dean is satisfied. 2-0

Cellco/ Verizon Land Development Plan- The Freedom Township Planning Commission had met on April 2, 2014 and gave recommendations to the Board to approve the Plan with all changes being made with exception of Item #15, 17, 18

1. Item 15-Dean states -The existing refuse storage area has been moved to provide a location for the Cell Tower Equipment Building. The refuse area is now shown where the loading dock was previously approved. This is not acceptable. The refuse area can be relocated in an existing parking space, as there are more spaces than required. The refuse storage area must conform to SALDO §407.G.2.C.9. - for fencing, architecturally compatible and view. Ken Farrell stated that the business had originally had two dumpsters and one was for recycling. Now all of the cardboard is taken out by skids and the second dumpster is not needed. He states the loading dock is not a dock per se, but trucks back up to the edge of the macadam and wheel the packages on the gravel area to the door. He states there is still plenty of room for one dumpster to set. (this is in the back corner). Dean had suggested the dumpster be in a parking space. But it was stated that all parking spaces are needed 3 weeks of the year. The owner could give up one, but it is less convenient. Bushes/shrubbery will fill in the area around the dumpster.

2. Item #17 Landscaping - The type and height of proposed evergreen trees is not shown. The tree height at time of planting should be a minimum of 6'. The type of shrubs is not shown. See SALDO §520 for the Landscaping information required. The developer will place arborvitae at the rear of the dumpsters.

3. Item #18 note should be added that any tree or shrub which was required on the previously approved Landscaping Plan, and which has now died is to be replaced. The engineer states previous landscaping issues are not an issue for this land development plan.

Mr. Farrell stated that the developer will be in compliance with the land development plan they submit at this time. Linus Fenicle had no problem with the financial security not being an issue.

Linus Fenicle has prepared the Tower Removal Agreement. Mr. Farrell states there is no need to record this agreement as there is the agreement between Verizon and the landowner that Verizon will bring the land back to the original condition if the tower is removed. Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Matt Young to give conditional approval to all Dean's comments of the March 19, 2014 letter of recommendation to the Board of Supervisors with exception of as stated previously #15-regarding dumpster, #17 -planting the arborvitae at the dumpster and # 18 previous landscape plan not an issue with this land development plan., #19 the financial security not an issue as Dean will have to inspect the property before any permit is given.

2-0 Mr. Farrell will complete the land development plan and forward it to Dean Shultz of Gettysburg Engineering. The completed plan will need to be signed by the Planning Commission Board and the Supervisors and recorded at the County as a preliminary/final plan.

Community Service Plan- Adams County Probation had asked if the township would sign an agreement to use people on probation for some odd jobs in the township. Matt declined. Allen had asked in the past-this is an as requested situation.

James Hobbs Parking Plan-Dean has reviewed the parking plan and the storm water plan submitted. Dean had spoken to Joyce stating he is satisfied with the plan. The Board made no motion to approve.




The Planning Commission Board will meet on May 7, 2014 to review the Gregory. Modern Transportation Land Development Plan.

No further discussion Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to adjourn. 2-0

May 14, 2014 Supervisor's Minutes

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on May 14, 2014 at the township building, 2184 Pumping Station Road, Fairfield, Pa. Present were Chairman Matt Young, Vice Chairman Dan Golliday and Supervisor Allen Beckett. Secretary Joyce Shindledecker, SEO/zoning Officer Dean Shultz, and solicitor Linus Fenicle were also present. Public in attendance were Tom Wolf and Jason Raup, Pa Game Commissioner.

Chairman Young brought the meeting to order at 8:07 p.m.

Chairman Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the minutes of April 9, 2014 meeting. 3-0

Vice Chairman Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the financial report. Joyce stated that she had unintentionally deposited the \$914.50 check back into the same account instead of the state account, so the item was again listed to be paid to the state account. Balance of the financials (all accounts) to date is \$310,167.78. 3-0

Public Comment-5K run/walk David L Grove August 16, 2014 Cunningham and Shriver Roads

Jason Raub of the Pa State Game Commission attended the meeting to ask the Board to give approval of a 5K (3.1 mile) memorial run/walk dedicated to WCO David L Grove to be held on Saturday, August 16, 2014. The event will begin at the Boyd's Bear Country facility in Cumberland Township and proceed to the Grove memorial on Shriver Road where David Grove was killed on November 11, 2010 while attempting to apprehend two deer poaching suspects. Mr. Raub has spoken to Cumberland Police and also to Andy Hanson of Liberty police. Mr. Raub presented the Board with the liability insurance certificate naming Freedom Township. Solicitor Fenicle would like the certificate to add (as in other events) Employees, Agents and Officials. Raub stated that doing this online only gave so much space, but he will make every effort to add the above. Allen Beckett stated concerns of the emergency management part of this event. Raub added that there will be EMS at the event. State and local police are very much involved in this event and will be directing the road closures. Cunningham Road will be closed the first 20 minutes of the race, then re-open one lane for the duration of the anticipated one hour run/walk. Shriver Road will be closed for the entire run/walk. Residents will be notified in advance of the road closures.

Allen Beckett made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the event with the review of the event satisfactorily by the Police Departments and the Emergency Management Personnel and the insurance certificate updated to the township solicitors satisfaction. 3-0

Allen added he would like to be updated as the event progresses as far as the emergency management as coordinator for Freedom Township. Registration on the event can be found at www.active.com.

Police Report-Chief Police Brand Briggs had a personal matter and was unable to attend this meeting. Joyce was emailed the following report: Miles driven 2914, Freedom Patrol 42.75 hrs, Freedom on Call 351.25 hrs, Freedom incidents 23.25 hrs, Patrol checks 138, vehicles stopped 13, traffic citations 11 (7 speeding, 6 stop sign detail), 6 warning notices.

Road Report-submitted by Edward Wenschhof
Joyce read his report:

- cleaned up sod, antiskid and loose, broken blacktop at intersections
- cold patch repairs on Shorbs Mill, Bingham, Shriver and McGlaughlin Roads
- took spreader, plow and lift off International truck
- order hidden driveway sign and post and installed at Lourim's on Middle Creek Road
(township reimbursed by Lourim)
- Maintenance work on lawn tractor
- Hauled 2A stone for Rohrbaugh and Natural Dam Roads

A total of 106 hours for the two road workers for April, 2014

Ed Wenschhof contacted Matt Young on a collapsed culvert on Chapman Road. Ed's question was if he was to repair, as this road gets no state funding. Ed is checking on the later, but is also fixing the culvert per Matt's (Road Supervisor) approval.
Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the submitted report. 3-0

There was discussion on the letter sent by Dan Moul recommending proper signage be placed at both end of roads warning motorists of the fresh tar and chips (after road work is finished). Ed wrote a request if he should order these types of signs. Matt will talk to Ed about this matter.

Chapman Road-Matt Young was approached by the new resident at the last house on Chapman Road, a grandson of former owner Betty Leatherman... He would like to build a garage. The road was never abandoned by the township when the road was changed to go over the new 15 highway many years prior. There was discussion on what the township can do to abandon this. Dean Shultz and Linus Fenicle both voiced their expertise on the subject. Linus legal advice is that the resident petitions the board to vacate the road, but there is the possibility that someone could challenge this request... The Board will make the decision and then an ordinance is put in place of the abandonment. The road is approximately 1/4 of a mile.

Greenmount Fire Company Report-Chief Brad Poland emailed the township secretary the following: 2 residential fires, 1 medical assist, 1 transfer, 1 vehicle accident
Of the above 1 Frederick County, 1 Carroll Valley Boro, 1 Fairfield Boro, 2 Cumberland Township
Provided mutual aid 4 times, received mutual add 1 time
It was noted by Dan Golliday that the mother's day breakfast was very exceptional.
Allen echoed

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No monthly reports were given to the township

Secretary Report-

Natural Dam Road-Last month the Board instructed Linus Fenicle to follow up to Jenny Cullison a reminder letter on an agreement with the township on the cul-d-sac-he did so, but there has been no response to the original or the follow up letter.

James Hobbs Parking Plan-A parking plan and storm water plan had been submitted to Dean Shultz and the township for review (the first plan submitted months ago had many recommendations from Mr. Shultz). Dean Shultz is satisfied with the paper plan submitted by Jack Powell, engineer for developer James Hobbs. The parking plan was required by the Zoning Hearing Board after a hearing was held for an expansion of a permitted use. There was a long discussion of the plan and the determination is that there are 35 parking spaces. There was discussion of the type of parking lot, millings or asphalt. Shultz stated that the township ordinance does not define paved just states paved. There has been an ongoing problem with the dust and mud that comes from the proposed parking area. Shultz states the written plan meets the conditions of the zoning hearing board. Penn dot approval has not been given, but there has been correspondence with Penn Pot and Hobbs.

Shultz stated Hobbs has been filling in the area but has not had the area compacted as the fill-ins resume. He states that if the compacted area sinks, Hobbs will need to fix the area. Matt's question to Shultz when everything is complete is it going to be what is shown on the plan?—Dean response-it is a good plan and the question is how will we get it done (by Hobbs?)

Dean states that the Board can only approve the plan and if it does not meet the drawn up plan, enforcement will be necessary.

The storm water in the townships ordinance requires as the storm water goes in an as-built plan and needs to be given to the board by the developers engineer.

The plan now is worded-entire parking area is to receive a dust-free surface coating (rolled millings, tar and chip or "similar". The board requests "similar" to be changed to "equivalent".

Allen Beckett made the motion

That the parking is to be finished 90 days from May 14, 2014 and to finish the storm water with the engineer providing the township with an as built storm water management plan. (On the parking plan) the wording surface of the parking lot should be changed from "similar" to "equivalent". Certification of the storm water installation is required by an engineer. August 14, 2014 deadline
And additionally; that the driveway is to be finished 90 days after the highway occupancy permit is issued to Mr. Hobbs (weather permitting) Matt seconded the motion.

Rusty Ryan of the Adams County Conservation District had visited the site and completed a follow-up inspection of the fill project and stated Soxx were installed around the perimeter and there are no violations observed.

Mid-year convention- the supervisor's mid-year convention will be held on Wednesday May 21, 2014, registration beginning at 6:00 pm. Joyce asked if anyone is attending the

convention; please let her know ASAP as there are prepared bag suppers (happy meals) for everyone attending. The convention is held at the Adams County Emergency Center at 230 Greenmyer Lane, Gettysburg.

Gregory/Modera Transportation- The planning meeting cancelled last month (because an updated plan with Dean's recommendation had not been received) is scheduled for June 4, 2014. The Gregory's Engineer, Jack Powell, requests a 60 day extension from May 15, 2014. Allen Beckett made a motion with a second by Matt Young to grant the extension. 3-0

Matt reminded the engineer, Jack Powell that the plan will need to be as specified, Dean recommendations of the blacktop paving on the plan to be built correctly or he will deny the plan. Dan Golliday voiced a yea to this matter. The Gregory plan is entirely different from the Hobbs plan. Hobbs was an existing business. The Gregory's is an entirely new business and must meet recommendations..

Allen suggested the township close the loophole on the word "paved" in the ordinance and that will require an amendment to the Subdivision Land Development Ordinance. Any updates would not effect plans already in progress.

Public Comment-None

Police Report-Brand Briggs report this was a quiet month. Freedom patrol for the month 32 hrs, on call 253 hours, incidents 16.25 hrs, 104 patrol check, 9 vehicles stopped 10 traffic citations/arrests, 2 warning notices. Brand stated he missed last month meeting on the discussion of the 5K run event on August 16, 2014 for the David Grove memorial run/walk. He has spoken to Mr. Raub and will keep abreast of the upcoming event. Allen Beckett stated he had not received anything on the EMS part. The homeowners on Shriver Road will be notified in advance of the road closure for that morning. There will be Emergency personnel on hand for the event.

They also did maintenance work on the tractor and mower. Totalled hours were 168.5 for the month. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the road expenses. 3-0 Ed gave no quotes on signs.

Fire Company Report- Joyce read Brad Poland's report of 7 calls for the month: 1 auto accident, 1 commercial fire alarm, 1 residential fire, 2 residential fire alarms, 2 brush

fires; of these 7; 3 in Freedom, 2 Cumberland, 1 Mt Joy, 1 Hamiltonban township. Greenmount received aid 3 times and assisted aid 4 times. Reminder of upcoming events Saturday June 14-Sportsmans event and Sunday June 15, 2014 Father's day breakfast. Dan and Allen gave praise to the Fire Company and its events.

Naill/Cullison agreement-Linus Fenicle has heard from Jenny Cullison on the agreement and she has two concerns. She would like signs posted of no parking a the cul d sac and also was concerned that the current cul d sac stay at this size. After much discussion the Board approved signs "No Parking "Between Dusk to Dawn" be placed and also stated that the township would require 20 more feet for snow plowing. The exact area will be noted in the survey when it is finished. There will be foot traffic to the creek so parking will be permitted during the daylight hours. A letter will be sent on the above to Ms. Cullison. The motion on the signs was made by Allen Beckett with a second by Matt Young. 3-0

Gregory/ Modern Transportation- Joyce stated the Planning Board had met on June 4, 2014 and had made comments on Dean Shultz 28 recommendations of his letter of June 2, 2014 and gave their recommendation of approval of the plan with regard to their comments.

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to grant a waiver that this plan be a preliminary/final plan. 3-0

Allen Beckett made a motion with a second by Matt Young to grant a waiver of the map begin shown in a scale of 1"-2000". 3-0

Dean stuck to his guns that the number of the highway entrance plan permit be noted on the plan. -Jack agreed to do so, hesitantly. The item number #4: E Vranrich will need to have a letter to Mr. Powell to accompany his Erosion and Sedimentation Control Plan. Linus Fenicle recommends conditions on item 4 & 5 (These are the Erosion control and the highway entrance permits).

6. off street Parking requires the parking lot to be paved. There was much discussion on the parking are paving. Dean suggests a minimum of 4" superpave 25 mm binders and 2' superpave 12.5 mm wear. The engineer proposed (2) 3' millings surface coats or (2) 3/8 chip stone surface coats. Matt Young had previously stated at the last meeting that this would be done as our engineer, Gettysburg Engineer requires as this is a new land development plan. The question of the Hobbs parking plan versus the Gregory land development plan was brought up. Matt stated he did not want to hear about the Hobbs parking plan. He had, at the zoning hearing for James Hobbs, asked the Zoning Board to require a Land Development plan. The zoning hearing board only required a parking plan to a preexisting business. Allen asked for an executive session. -the Board decided to continue with the other recommendation than go into session.

Number 8- recommendation of Dean the SALDO requires a 20 ft in depth barrier between residential and industrial properties. This plan shows parking within 10 ft of the neighbor Miller. Dean had no problem with Hobbs side as this is agricultural. Paul (Kellett) stated he had been approached by the Millers and they like the plan with the 6 foot fence) Also the trucks will be parked up to the fence therefore having them as a barrier also. Matt stated that he is requesting a letter from the Millers stating they are

satisfied with this current plan as far as the landscape issue beside them. Allen Beckett suggests a few trees also be planted.

8. SALDO requires a registered landscape Architect prepare the landscape plans. Developer is requesting a waiver. Allen suggests planting evergreens along 15 although the ordinance does not allow evergreens. Dan Golliday made a motion to grant the waiver with a second by Young 2-1 Allen Ney.

9. The Engineer must agree to change the plan to read the developer must replace any trees that dies within 2 years. Agreed to change

10. SALDO requires landscaping in parking lots.

Engineer for developer, Powell stated that is not for industrial areas but more for a parking lot at a shopping center.

Not requiring this is done.

11. Dean is requiring a Note be stated on the plan to have "no outdoor storage area or refuse storage"—he has seen this type of thing before and the developers ---

Engineer agrees to put the note on the plan.

12. Stormwater- already discussed

13. Existing Well the Planning Board suggested a well cap, sump pump (to pump out any excess water) be put in well pit with an alarm set to go off. The Board and Dean suggest the well pit be grading with a 3' grading so that run off can occur and the developer agrees to a note on the plan that the township not be held responsible if well becomes contaminated. The well pit will be in the area where the trucks park as this is the existing well area. The trucks will back over the pit. The developers engineer agrees to a 2% slope on the grading.

14. SALDO states no change in existing topography can be made which will result in a slope of more than 10% within 20 feet of a property long. Dean states there are area along the majority of the Basins that do not meet these criteria. A waiver is requested. Beckett made a motion by Golliday to grant waiver. 3-0

15. Skip between Eric Vranrich and developers Engineer ENS Plan figures are needed.

16. a. SALDO use of other available runoff control measure can be employed as approved by the Township. The minimum freeboard depth can be reduced from 1.0 feet to .5 feet. Dean recommends a waiver be granted as requested. Matt Young makes the motion to approval the waiver with a second by Allen Beckett. 3-0

17.SALDO requires energy dissipating devices shall be placed at all basin outlets. All necessary calculations for rip-rap must be provided. Jack Powell agrees to put on plan.

18. After discussion on maximum slopes of Basin a waiver is granted with a motion by Allen Beckett second by Young The 2 basins on the Emmitsburg Road waived. 3-0

Matt Young is requesting this be in the letter from the Millers (neighbor) regarding the Stormwater discharge onto their property.

19. Dean insists on the note that the Developers Engineer must provide an as-built plan of the storm water facilities and certify they are built in accordance to Plans and specifications. Jack agrees to put the noted on the plan.

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20. Needs a revision of a 2 % slope of the outfall pipe slope with the SWM Bio-retention Area 1B detail in Sheet DTL1. Jack Powell agrees to this revision
21. Basin 2 will not dewater in 72 hours in accordance with the recommended dewatering time in the PA BMP Manual-Between Jack & Eric Vranich . Jack states this is required in the ENS report.
22. Powell agrees to the labeling of SE<#1A and SWM#1B on Sheet PR1 should be reviewed and it appears the labels on these basins are reversed.
23. Powell agrees the recommended seed mixture for the basin floors should be provided with the plan drawings on the ENS
24. There are minor discrepancies in WS-4 for Drainage Are 1 between WS-4 and the routings. Eric and Jack will discuss
- 25 Financial Security-- the Engineering cost Estimate in accordance with SALDO §516 Must be submitted and approved for the Stormwater Facilities, Landscaping Buffer and Traffic Control Sign. Must be approved by Linus Fenicle. Jack will do
- 26a Stormwater management and maintenance Agreement satisfactory to Linus Fenicle must be approved, signed and recorded. Jack will do
27. The township should determine if the parking spaces should be striped and curbs or bumper blocks provided. Jack and the developer agreed to the planning Board suggestion that a handicapped parking space provide these.
- Dan Golliday asked about the fence area-Developer stated there is a slight berm there in the ten foot section before the fencing.
- 28 No signs per the developer
- Allen Beckett makes a motion second by Golliday to have an executive session 3-0
- Meeting begins from the potential litigation executive session
- Allen Beckett stated that the Board has worked with the Developer and his engineer and has granted a lot of waivers tonight

1. A Pennsylvania Department of Transportation Highway Entrance Permit must be secured for a driveway entrance to the truck facilities from Emmitsburg Road. SALDO Section 304.A.16.
2. An Erosion and Sedimentation Control Permit must be secured from the Adams County Conservation District and the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. SALDO Section 304.B.16.
3. The paving detail on Sheet DTL-4 showing use of millings for paving must be revised to show that 3/8" tar and chip surface treatment will be placed on top of millings and the tar and chip detail then removed. The following specifications must be added to the detail:
 - (a) The type and amount of emulsion to be applied must be shown and be satisfactory to the Township.
 - (b) The millings must be of a size and type, which can be spread uniformly with a paving machine, and a paving machine must be used to place the millings.
 - (c) Each layer of millings must be rolled and compacted with a 10-ton or equivalent vibratory roller.
 - (d) The type and amount of hot liquid asphalt to be used for the tar and chip surface coat must be shown and be satisfactory to the Township.
 - (e) The tar and chip surface must be rolled.

This is in lieu of the standards set forth in Section 404.A.2 of the Land Development and Subdivision Ordinance.

4. The Plan must be revised to correct the energy dissipating devices at the basin outlets. SALDO Section 507.E.8.
5. The seed mixture and fertilization to be used in basins must be shown and approved by the Township.
6. Note 13 must be revised to state as follows: "The Developer's Engineer must provide an as-built Plan of the Stormwater Facilities and certify they are built in accordance to Plans and Specifications."
7. An Engineering Cost Estimate must be submitted and approved for the Stormwater Facilities, Landscaping, Lighting, Traffic Control Signs and Parking Lot construction.
8. Financial Security in the amount of the Engineering Cost Estimate plus 10% must be approved by the Township Solicitor. SALDO Section 516.
9. A Stormwater Management and Maintenance Agreement, satisfactory to the Township Solicitor, must be approved by the Township, signed and recorded.
10. The detail on the Plan showing the handicap-parking layout must show that the lines are to be painted.
11. 50% of the trees shown along U.S. 15 as a buffer are to be evergreens.
12. The fence adjacent to the Millers' residential property is to be 8' high.
13. The well detail on Sheet DTL-4 is to be revised to show that a sealed manhole with poured concrete bottom will be used. A pump is not required.
14. A note shall be added to the Plan that states "As a condition of approval of this Plan, the truck facilities parking area shall be maintained in a dust free and mud free condition. Failure to do so will be a violation of the approval of this Plan and subject Owner to the Enforcement Provisions and Penalties prescribed in the SALDO".

These conditions must be accepted within 15 days of this letter or the Plan will be considered denied. All conditions must be met within 180 days from the date of the letter unless said time is extended by the Board of Supervisors.

Rob Thaeler explained the joint comprehensive plan concept to the Board and assured the Board that this plan will not change the township's zoning or individual zoning board. Dean Shultz stated that this plan if adopted by Freedom will be copied and put in a box and found several years later, but has no bearing on the Freedom Zoning Board. If at some point the Board would agree to joint zoning there would be one Zoning Board for the Boros, and Townships in the Joint Zoning Agreement. Highland Township is not interested in joining the comprehensive plan. Carroll Valley, Fairfield Boro, Hamiltonban and Liberty (although still working on joining) are on board according to Thaeler. Tom Wolf asked how (if adopted) when this is printed residents will know if a township is included-Thaeler stated that the adopting resolutions for each township will be in the front of the Comp Plan. Tom Wolf stated that MDCC has read the plan and urges the board of Supervisors to also read the plan. He offered no comments on the plan.

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Matt Young asked Dean Shultz how long it would take him to review the plan. Dean-2 days. Rob Thaeler will get Dean Shultz a copy of the Plan. Matt Young stated that it would take a lot for him to adopt the plan, but if Thaeler will continue to let Freedom do as they have been doing (have representation from Freedom -Planning member Paul Kellett) he agreed the planning board could participate in the public meeting, joining Freedom in the advertisement for such meeting.

No further comments—Meeting adjourned with motions. 3-0

Naill/Natural Dam Road-Linus is finalizing the agreement. This may happen at the next or future meetings.





- Workers compensation for the fire company, have risen as of 2014; \$3,000.00. due to cancer claims throughout the insurance world.

The final figures for end of 2015 - \$237,367.00.

Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to tentatively approve the budget prepared. 2-0

Brad Poland asked why the decrease in funds from \$24,000. to \$18,000. Allen Beckett stating that reviewing the fire company monthly expenses, the expenses is between 1500-1600, therefore the decrease still covers the majority of their expenses.

There was discussion on the workers compensation increase, and any other donations to the fire company. There was a question if Cumberland is providing any money from their fire tax. Brad stated that he understands the fire company needs to make a request for any fire tax and they have not done that. As far as the workers compensation, Matt asked Joyce to look into why Cumberland does not provide any workers compensation coverage to Greenmount by discussing this with our insurance carrier, Eric Bergdale of

Bergdale Insurance. (Note: Joyce emailed Eric and he stated this is something the townships need to discuss between themselves).

The budget will be advertised and available at the township window for the next 20 days for review and formally adopted at the December 10, 2014 Supervisor's meeting.

Next month Planning Commission meets on December 3, 2014 to review a lot addition submitted by Allen Beckett.

Next week is the Supervisors yearly townships convention to be held at SAVES. Door open at 4:45 and the meeting begins at 6:00. Reservations have been made.



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Minutes February 11, 2015 Supervisors meeting

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on February 11, 2015 at the township building, 2184 Pumping Station road, Fairfield, Pa 17320.

Present were Chairman Matt Young, Vice Chairman Dan Golliday and Allen Beckett. Also present was Liberty Police Chief, Brand Briggs, SEO/Zoning officer Dean Shultz of Gettysburg Engineering, Secretary Joyce Shindledecker and Road Superintendent Edward Wenschhof. Also in attendance were Thomas Wolf and Richard Hobbs.

Matt Young called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. Matt made a motion with a second by Dan to approve the minutes of the January 5, 2015 regular and reorganizational meeting. 3-0

Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the financial report. Ed Wenschhof stated he had not bought anything From K.M. Kuntz so that check was voided (26.34). 3-0

(Also the check for KJ Shindledecker printed to the wrong vendor- Adams County Auto (55.72), the check was voided. This was noticed when distributing the checks. This check will be reissued in March.)

Public Comment-None

Police Report-Brand Briggs read the report for January Patrol --38.25 hrs, On call 244.5 hrs, incidents 18 hrs, vehicles stopped 6 with 2 traffic citations/arrests and 5 warning notices. Brand stated that one officer resigned, another officer had an injury. Brand was putting in a lot of extra time but will be interviewing to fill a part-time employee. He stated that as last year he will be having a scheduled active shooter training administered with a 30,000. Federal grant. Brand is looking into taking a course so that he can become an instructor to teach staff employees (schools, etc.) how to respond to an incident. A goat from a Gordon Road resident kept the officers stepping when it made its rounds to other townships and as far as ski liberty. Although he did not know the owner, the goat is now back at home on Gordon Road. Brand stated there was a large pot hole on Boyie Road. Ed Wenschhof stated that had been taken care of and filled.

Road Report-Ed submitted the following report-plowed and antiskid roads. Welty Backhoe hauled 2 loads of antiskid to the township. The int'l truck was taken for inspection at Sanders garage and Ed replaced the hydraulic coupling on the int truck plow. 116 hours total for the month.

Road inspection and line painting-The topic of painting lines on the township roads was discussed. Ed would like to put this out for bids, but he would like the Board to do a road inspection (including him) prior in case other roads need improved and then lines can be done on several roads with one bid. The Board agreed to meet with Ed on February 20, 2015 at 1:30 p.m. There have been no inspections for several years, although scheduled, did not occur. Matt approved the report with a second by Dan. 3-0

Fire Company Report-Chief Brad Poland submitted the report via email - 8calls for the month of January-2 vehicle accident, 1 residential fire alarm, 1 transfer, 1 landing zone, 1 request for fire police. Of the prior 4 Cumberland, 2 Frederick County, 1 Freedom, 1 Washington Township. Received mutual aid 3 times provided mutual aid 4 times. The next event is a Sportman's Drawing on March 14, 2015. Tickets are \$25.00. Tickets available through members.

Secretary Report

Joyce stated that she had completed many reports for year end and had also met with PennDot auditors, Workers comp auditors and insurance provider, Eric Bergdale. She invited the Board to review the insurance coverage at any time.

Richard Hobbs-Letter of Credit Mr. Hobbs is requesting the release of the letter of credit to ACNB. Dean Shultz stated the Board had asked for the letter of credit for Mr. Hobbs to plant 58 trees, parking, provide drain lines for stormwater and to erect signs. Mr. Hobbs stated that all of those requirements have been met. The Board asked Mr. Shultz to inspect the property and let Joyce know and she can release the letter to the ANCB. 3-0

Richard Hobbs Holding Tank Agreement-Mr. Hobbs was required by the National Building Code to have a public restroom in his Cycle Repair Shop. Mr. Hobbs applied for a holding tank permit. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the standard holding tank agreement approved by solicitor Linus Fenicle. The pumping reports should be forwarded to the township or to Gettysburg Engineering as they are done. 3-0

Resolution -adopt sewage facilities fee schedule-Allen Beckett made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the fee schedule prepared by Gettysburg Engineering and additionally approve the sewage module fee to \$100.00 with a \$40.00 fee for each additional lot. 3-0

Adams County Road Classification-The County had sent a new road classification printout to the township. The only township road to change would be the small portion of Bullfrog Road which is the township's responsibility from Pumping Station to Liberty Township line. Dean added that the county was looking into this because of SDLD ordinance which have minor roads(50ft) and collector roads. (60ft) The right ways differ on these road. Allen Beckett agreed to take care of the review and a meeting with Dean Shultz on this matter.

Resolution for Certificate of Deposit PNC Bank- The township had received notification that the CD bought at PNC was going to be turned over to escheats (sent to the state for unclaimed money) The township has received the interest report on the CD every quarter since 1994 when it was entered into with the bank. Joyce was frantic when the letter came. Joyce went to the bank with the form to have the CD released from the escheats procedure. She had spoken to Heidi at the Gettysburg branch. Heidi stated that even if the CD was released from escheats the township could not take the money out because the Heidi said the state requires two things to be down prior to a CD taken out for a business. First of all the township is not a business and secondly Joyce had the original CD in hand and the bank had the information on their banking records. Joyce called Linus for his expertise Linus called this Heidi and she gave him the same run a round. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the written resolution of 2015-2-11 to have Joyce go to PNC when the CD comes due at February end and get the money in a check to Freedom Township and invest the money in another bank in another CD with interest investigated. 3-0 Allen Beckett stated that Kathy Michaels at the Zora branch may be helpful in resolving this CD issue.

Hobbs/Modern Transportation-Back months ago the Board had asked Joyce to have Mr. Hobbs have his engineer (Jack Powell) send a letter of certification on the SWM system for the Truck Parking Facility.

On January 28, 2015 the Board finally received this certification memo. The Board and Mr. Shultz are still stumped why there has been no Penn Dot approval for the driveway entrance. Allen thought this may have to do with the entrance already being there. The Board suggested Dean Shultz contacting Penn Dot on the delay. Apparently Allen knew that the delay problem was on an "angle" concern by Pen Dot and Beyond on Boundaries was doing a survey on this driveway for the Penn Dot permit. There may have also been a delay in getting the permit started a while back. Dean will contact Penn Dot.

Hobbs/Micro -mound- Mr. James Hobbs Jr is making improvements on the former Herr property on Bullfrog Road. Dean had sent several letters regarding the property and the sewage system. Mr. Powell sent a letter /memo of January 25, 2015 stating that Carrie Wilt of PA DEP and Powell discussed the property. He states the dwelling complies with the design data of the sewage system. Dean stated that he did not know why Jack Powell was sending information to the township instead of Mr. Hobbs. Dean had only requested that the building design on the number of bedrooms be given to him and to the building inspector. He did not know why they were being treated as the "poor cousins". All he asks is that Mr. Hobbs comes to or calls his office.

19th Century Baseball July 18-19 on Pumping station Road former Shields property-the plan has been received and the application fee and the review fee. Mr. Shultz will have the review for the March 11, 2015 meeting.

Monocacy Stormwater-Allen Beckett had attended a meeting at the Adams County conservation District. He learned that possibly the township can increase 5,000 ft to 10,000 ft for land owners to do their own stormwater plan. This is possibly allowed to townships with larger lots. Dean stated that in order to do this the ordinance would have to be changed. He asked how Rusty Ryan can change an ordinance the County adopted? Dean will contact Rusty on particulars.

Cell Tower-the permit has been issued.

Gloryridge Fireworks display at Weddings-Dean had received a complaint on Firework display at a wedding a few weeks ago at GloryRidge. Allen Beckett stated that he had been contacted as Emergency Coordinator of the township and he had inspected the certification and paperwork of the company setting off the fireworks. He stated everything was in order. The Board disagreed that Allen had the authority to ok the fireworks. They stated that the fire police chief should be the person to approve. And the township should be listed on the liability insurance and all the township employees as any event of the township approves. Allen stated that Glory Ridge always wants to comply with anything asked of them. Dan disagreed stating when Glory Ridge first came to them it was going to be a campground, no liquor, no catering except for breakfast for people occupying the cabins, no weddings and a long list of things they were not asking to do so he was not eager to agree they were willing to comply. They should have contacted the fire chief or the township officials not just Allen Beckett on this event. Brand agreed that he did not have the expertise on this subject. He knew there were a lot of people at fault in an incident in Gettysburg after a fireworks display several years ago when a child lost fingers after picking up fireworks days after the event at the carnival. Allen stated that the personnel at Gloryridge had called into County Control and Kim (Frank) was happy, he did not know about John Eline. Dean stated he had talked to Denise at Glory Ridge and there was another wedding fireworks display scheduled in June 2015. Dean stated that they should provide a minimum \$500 bond, require a million liability or 500,00 as some township do and have the fire chief investigate each event and check the site

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after the event is over and name the township and its employees. Dean wants to check with Linus on whether there should be an ordinance or a resolution although a resolution asks for no penalty.

No further comments from the Board or Public Matt Young made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to adjourn. 3-0

Supervisors Meeting minutes of March 11, 2015

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on March 11, 2015 at the township building. Present were Chairman Matt Young, Supervisor Allen Beckett, Secretary Joyce Shindledecker, SEO Dean Shultz, Liberty Police Chief Brand Briggs, Solicitor Linus Fenicle and Road Superintendent, Edward Wenschhof, and tax collector Brenda Snyder. Supervisor Dan Golliday had another commitment.

Public in attendance were Tom Wolf, Randy Phiel, Jim Fox, Sherrin Poland, and John Javor.

Matt Young called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

Matt Young made a motion to approve the minutes of February 11, 2015 with a second by Allen Beckett. 2-0

Allen Beckett made a motion with a second to approve the financial report with an amendment to approve a bill forthcoming from McNair for antiskid (if payment is needed before the next meeting). 2-0

Public Comment-Brenda Snyder stated that as tax collector she is required to have 6 credits per year at \$40.00 per credit costing her \$240. She states this is taking her 6 hours to complete. Also she is required to have a background check completed. She commented that perhaps these requirements (ongoing education credits) are to eliminate small township tax collectors. Also there are fees for her checks and envelopes to send out the taxes. (These have been reimbursed each year) These fees are divided between the county and the township with the school refusing to reimburse for these expenses although most of the revenue goes to the school. Brenda stated she grosses around \$5,000. per year from all collections. She asked about the possibility of tax collectors being able to collect for more than one municipality. Linus Fenicle stated that perhaps the Board would reimburse for credits but not the background check. The Board tabled any decision to reimburse Brenda for reimbursement of credits until all supervisors are present at the April meeting. Commissioner Phiel was in attendance and stated he will speak to the County employees involved in the Tax Collection office, Darrell and Barbara.

Police Report Liberty Chief Brand Briggs gave the report-76 patrol checks for Freedom 1 warning notice, 2 alarms, 79 miscellaneous, 1 stolen vehicle which actually was not (from Auto auction) 1 thefts, 4 traffic, 1 vehicle stopped. Brand stated that the **American Odyssey Group** will again be running through the township on May 1-2, 2015 and the township and its administrators are named on the insurance as usual. No permits are required. Allen asked if they would be advertising. (There will probably be something if not already in the newspaper). Brand also mentioned the Drug Take Back program will be Saturday, April 25, 2015 from 10-2 at the Fairfield Fire Company where he is going to be set up and also in Gettysburg at the Recreation Park and the Gettysburg Fire Company.

Road Report-Ed submitted - Ed and Mike Wenschhof plowed and antiskid roads throughout the snow, freezing rain and ice most of the month. Very windy and drifting also. They repaired potholes on Boyle Road. Ed met with John Johns from HA Thomas, Inc. All records were in order. Ed replace plow edge on the Dodge, and picked up kerosene for the heater. Fred Welty pulled the truck out which was stuck on Rohrbaugh Road. They did misc. shop maintenance and repairs. They salted and antiskided Boyle Road at the fire site during the hauling and pumping operations. There was a total of 101 hours for the

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month. Brand mentioned the condition of State Rd, Cunningham -the portion between Shriver and the Bridge is pretty busted up from the weather. Allen made a motion with a second by Matt to approve the road report. 2-0

Greenmount Fire Company Report-submitted by Brad Poland Fire Chief- 9 calls for the month 3 residential, 1 chimney, 1 vehicle accident, 1 medical assist, 1 misc. fire, 1 request for officer. Of the 9, 5 Freedom, 2 Cumberland, 1 Frederick c. 1 Mt Joy Township. Greenmount received aid 5 times gave aid 2 times.

Secretary Report-

19th Century Baseball to be held July 18-19 at 965 Pumping Station Road. The event has been held at this location the past two years. The planners are asking for a waiver again for a traffic control person. Dean reviewed the plan and the current parking flow plan was added. Linus reviewed the insurance certificate and Dean stamps his approval. The \$1000 security deposit will be sent to the township prior to the event and returned uncashed at the end if everything is undisturbed (roads). Amusement tax will be taken from the vendors on site and divided between the township and the school. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the plan including granting the waiver for not requiring a traffic control person and the requirement of the \$1,000 Security Deposit to be sent to the township in advance of the event. 2-0

PNC CD-Joyce Shindldecker received the funds from the PNC CD and is looking into getting a 5 yr CD at ACNB approved from the bank CFO for the rate of 1.75. The initial rate was 1.25 but Joyce asked the bank to match the Susquehanna Bank rate of 1.75. ACNB agreed to do so. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to proceed with the CD buying for the amount of \$59,163.50. Joyce will be a signer as well as Allen Beckett. 2-0

ACTPO report from the County-Joyce received the report with the breakdown of population, ethnics and ages in the Adams County townships. Allen agreed to review the ordinance prior to the adoption at the County level and pass onto the other Board members as well.

Gettysburg Anniversary Committee-The Township received the plan for the 152nd re-enactment to be held at 965 Pumping Station Road. Dean has not reviewed the plan as it was given to him earlier today. PDF files were sent to all necessary officials in the area. The \$3,000. Escrow fee has been received. The insurance will be sent to Linus Fenicle 30 days prior to the event for his review. The amusement tax collected for this event is split between the school district and the township. Randy Phiel explained the event may be a slight bit (hopefully) larger than last year's event and the event will be held July 3,4,5, 2015. The same vendors and suppliers will be used as in the past. There will be no use of Cunningham or Red Rock Roads. The sewage permit for the jiffy Johns has been applied for with the rate of \$295.00 as in the past. Allen Beckett will be reviewing the plan on behalf of the township as the Emergency Coordinator.

Lodges of Gettysburg and Fire Works displays Allen stated that the Lodges have agreed to have a fire truck on site as they have not had in the past. -To date the township has no fireworks ordinance. If the township has no ordinance they cannot issue a permit. If the township is not regulating the use of fireworks, the township has no liability. The company providing the fireworks must have a secure storage area, be bonded and insured by the ATF. Fireworks are regulated by a state law. Linus had a

sample ordinance which he will send to the township. Allen stated that the event coordinators do let residents know in the immediate area that the display is occurring. No action was taken.

James Hobbs Jr. property-on Boyle Road behind Shorbs-the old Shorb farm has applied for an Erosion Sediment Control permit. Dean did not receive a narrative with the plan so he has no idea what is happening at this site. Matt stated this was a fill area and Allen added he thought they (Hobbs) were enlarging the site. Jack Powell is the engineer so Dean will get the narrative from him.

James Hobbs Sr.-Mr. Hobbs had a house fire and Dean Shultz permit officer is asking the board to waive the zoning permit fee on the new construction. Allen made a motion with a second by Matt to waive the fee. 2-0 The permit will still be required. Brenda Snyder commended them for waiving the fee.

Tim Shields property Pumping Station Road-Mr. Shields has sold the 2nd lot coming from Sachs Mill Bridge. Originally Mr. Shields, although subdivided the property into large lots, had hoped to keep the lots, but an offer was far too good and he has changed his mind and sold this property and there will be a house constructed at this site. Mr. Shields had put restrictions on the property during the subdivision and he will work with the homeowner on these restrictions.

Hazardous Mitigation Resolution-next month

Gregory review fees-Mr. & Mrs. Gregory are rebutting the invoice of \$3,324.00 submitted by Mr. Dean Shultz for his review of the land development ordinance. The invoice is paid by the township and then a check is printed from township escrow funds to Dean. There are no trucks from Modern Transportation on the property and the Gregorys have not continued with their LD Plan after the Boards review last year. They did not agree with the construction required by the Board of Supervisors for their parking lot. Linus is looking into the matter of the unpaid invoice.

Supervisors Meeting minutes of April 8, 2015

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on April 8, 2015 at the township building. Present were Chairman Matt Young, Vice Chairman Dan Golliday, Supervisor Allen Beckett, Secretary Joyce Shindledecker, SEO Dean Shultz, Liberty Police Chief Brand Briggs, and Solicitor Linus Fenicle. Public in attendance were Tom Wolf, Randy Phiel, Jim Fox, and George Lomas.

Matt Young called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

Matt Young made a motion to approve the minutes of March 11, 2015 with a second by Dan Golliday. 3-0

Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the financial report. Finances totaled \$316,384.92 3-0

Public Comment-Tom Wolf stated that the sign was now up on Pumping Station off Tract Road. He can find the intersection now. This is a Penn Dot Road.

Police Report Liberty Chief Brand Briggs gave the report-This month was a slow month he was able to take a week vacation, 87 patrol checks for Freedom, 1 warning notice, 1 disabled vehicle and 1 vehicle stopped. Brand stated that the Bird Watchers admiring the Short haired owl was the most police work for the time period with some vehicles parking along Pumping Station Road (across from Nancy Bushey farm.) Brand also mentioned the Drug Take Back program will be Saturday, April 25, 2015 from 10-2 at the Fairfield Fire Company where he is going to be set up and also in Gettysburg at the Recreation Park and the Gettysburg Fire Company. A New Bike Ride has notified him; going from Gettysburg to the Sach's Bridge where they might ask for a rest stop then will move along to the Adams County Winery. The event is scheduled for June 13, 2015. Dan Golliday is concerned about the drug and heroin use coming to the area from Hanover and Taneytown. Brand stated he is in direct contact with the County Drug Task Force and the State Police.

Road Report-Ed submitted - Ed and Mike Wenschhof plowed and antiskid roads throughout the snow, freezing rain. They repaired potholes on Boyle Road and McGlaughlin Roads. Fred Welty hauled 2 loads of antiskid from the Quarry. They did misc. shop maintenance and repair on plow. McNair brought a load of salt (as mentioned in March). Scott Road was closed overnight on March 11, 2015 due to flooding from the ice storm. Alexander Plumbing repaired pipe and faucets in men's room in shop. Trash pickup and misc cleanup on the roads. There were a total of 101 hours for the month. Allen made a motion with a second by Matt to approve the road report. 3-0

Ed inquired about a road inspection ASAP. The Board scheduled a road inspection for Tuesday April 14, 2015 at 5:00 pm.

Greenmount Fire Company Report-submitted by Brad Poland Fire Chief- 15 calls for the month -5 residential, 2 medical assist, 1 barn fire, 1 commercial fire, 1 vehicle fire, 1 brush fire, 1 vehicle accident with entrapment, 1 outside investigation. Of the 15, 4 in Frederick Co, 3 Freedom, 3 Cumberland, 1 Mt Joy Township, 1 Libetry, 1 Gettysburg Boro, 1 Straban, 1 Highland. Greenmount received aid 2 times gave aid 11 times. The mother's day breakfast is scheduled for May 10th 7-11 a.m. Dan mentioned about the last Gun Raffle being a success. Sold out event.

Secretary Report-

Gettysburg Anniversary Committee-The Township received the plan for the 152nd re-enactment to be held at 965 Pumping Station Road. Dean reviewed the plan with very few comments which have been taken care of by Jim Fox. Linus will review the insurance when it comes before him 30 days prior to the event. The 3,000. bond has been posted and the amusement tax will be paid as the event tickets are sold as in the past. PDF files were sent to all necessary officials in the area. The amusement tax collected for this event is split between the school district and the township. Randy Phiel explained the event may be a slight bit (hopefully) larger than last year's event and the event will be held July 3, 4, 5, 2015. The same vendors and suppliers will be used as in the past. The sewage permit for the jiffy Johns has been applied for with the rate of \$295.00 as in the past. Allen Beckett reviewed the plan on behalf of the township as the Emergency Coordinator. Matt Young mad a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to give conditional approval subject to the insurance review. 3-0 Allen asked GAC committee to notify him when the event is setting up and he will visit the site.

Lodges of Gettysburg and Fire Works - To date the township has no fireworks ordinance. If the township has no ordinance they cannot issue a permit. If the township is not regulating the use of fireworks, the township has no liability. The company providing the fireworks must have a secure storage area, be bonded and insured by the ATF. Fireworks are regulated by a state law. Linus sent a sample ordinance to the township after the last meeting. Allen stated that the event coordinators do let residents know in the immediate area that the display is occurring. Allen is asking Denise (administrator for Gloryridge) to come to the May meeting and the Board will hear directly from her what the Campground is requiring and how often the fireworks will be taking place. The Board needs to hear from the Campground rather than second hand on what will be happening in the future. Linus said that the township does not have an ordinance in place, but it would be ok to have her attend if that is what the Board asks.

Dean reported Allen Beckett is building 4 more Cabins at Gloryridge for which Dean has given a temporary occupancy permit. The permit expires on June 30, 2015 giving Allen time to finish the landscaping and the storm water and then a permanent occupancy permit will be given.

Tax Collector Fees-Brenda Snyder had told the Board last month of the expenses she incurs with the ongoing training credits required with the tax collector position. Allen Beckett made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve payment of the credits and expenses associated with keeping up her credentials as Freedom Township Tax collector. 3-0.

Complaint from Fred Lourim submitted a written complaint on Ron Berkhiser's house/ porch falling down Middle Creek Road-the Board will not take any action on the letter. This would require a nuisance ordinance which would get into barking dogs, falling houses, chickens on the road, etc. Townships who have ordinance spend years trying to get residents to take care of these kinds of situations. Joyce will contact the Lourims on the Boards position.

Hazardous Mitigation Resolution-Allen Beckett made a motion with a second by Matt Young to approve the Resolution. 3-0

Comments from Engineer /Zoning Officer/SEO-Dean Shultz

Possible subdivision-Dean advised the Board that the persons (Norman Brown family) who bought the Woods Property on Pumping Station Road have inquired about subdividing 2 lots for their daughters.

Cell Tower-Dean reported the cell tower progressing- No flag up that will be one of the final things-a ways to go on this project.

James Hobbs Sr.-Mr. Hobbs had a house fire and Dean Shultz asked the board to waive the zoning permit fee on the new construction. They did this last month. Steve Hobbs picked up a building permit application a few weeks ago. Dean Shultz has not heard anything from Hobbs since.

James Hobbs Jr. -former Herrs' property Bullfrog Road- The RV situation seems to be ongoing. Dean had reported this to the Board last year. Apparently someone is still living there. Matt told Dean to take care of this situation even if it means prosecution. This is costing the township money with letters sent, attorney counselling. Supervisors meeting September 9, 2015 Minutes

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors met on September 9, 2015 at 8:00 at the Freedom Township Building 2184 Pumping Station Road.

Present were Chairman Matt Young, Vice-Chair Dan Golliday, Allen Beckett, Secretary Joyce Shindedecker, Solicitor Linus Fenicle, Liberty Police Chief Brand Briggs, Zoning officer Dean Shultz and public Tom Wolf and engineering firm Beyond all Boundaries representative, Ken Scott.

Matt Young called the meeting to order and made a motion with a second by Dan Golliday to approve the minutes of the August 12, 2015 meeting. 3-0

Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the financial report with the addition to the report of \$110.00 to The Gettysburg Times for the stone bid. 3-0

Police Report-Read by Brand Briggs-63 Patrol check in Freedom, 3 vehicles stopped, 4 traffic citations/arrests and 0 warning notices. Again stated the reenactment had went smoothly with only two problems; as reported last month. Dean Shultz stated that there was a problem at the Baseball event with vehicles sinking. Matt stated long as there was no mud drug onto Pumping Station Road, there is no issue.

Road Report-Ed Wenschhof had submitted the report-

- Mowing and string trimming, brush & limb cutting and trash pickup along the township roadways and the township lot.
- Cleared fallen trees on Shorbs Mill Rd and Middle creek Rd.
- Issued a driveway permit to Knight Builders for John Purdy on Shriver Rd.
- Had Kint Fire Ext Co do yearly checkups and service fire extinguishers.
- Closed Scott Rd on 20th due to flooding and cleaned up at culverts on McGlaughlin Rd that also flooded over.
- Had string trimmer repaired at Harringtons.
- Did misc mtc. & repair on tractor and mower.

A total of 137 hours for the month. Dan Golliday made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to approve the road report as submitted. 3-0

Stone Bid- Joyce had advertised the stone bid and received one bid from Valley Quarries. Matt Young made a motion with a second by Allen Beckett to award the stone bid to New Enterprise Stone & Lime Co (Valley Quarries). 3-0

Fire Company Report-submitted by Brad Poland- There were a total of 8 calls for the month for Greenmount Fire company with 3 commercial fire alarms, 2 transfers, 1 brush fire, 1 vehicle accident and 1 outside investigation. Of the 8 calls, 2 in Freedom, 2 in Mt. Joy, 2 in Frederick Md, 1 in G-burg boro, 1 in York Springs. Greenmount received mutual aid twice and provided mutual aid 6 times.

Tom Wolf commented on an article in the Washington Post which read over the last 10 years home fire are down 50 % but the cost of the fire companies were way up.

Secretary Report-

Joyce had two subdivision that the planning board had discussed at their meeting last week September 2, 2015 and had forwarded to the Board of Supervisors for approval (with comments from Dean - Gettysburg Engineering being revised on the plans.)

Isaac Hill Bullfrog Road 5.179 acres on the north side of the road being a lot addition to James Hobbs Jr, adjoining neighbor. Adams County Planning and Gettysburg Engineering had reviewed the plans and submitted comments. A.C. were generalization comments.

Gettysburg Engineering provided the following comments:

Hill proposes to sell this 5.179 acre lot to James Hobbs, Jr., an ad joiner, as a lot addition to Hobbs present lot. In 1998 David Kass, the Owner of Lot 1 at that time, purchased Lot 3 (5.179 acre tract) from Marlin Shorb to enlarge his property.

The following notes were on the 1998 subdivision Plan.

1. Lot #2 shall be conveyed to David & Juanita Kass; owners of the adjoining parcel. It shall become a part of that parcel and may not be separately sold, conveyed, leased, used, possessed or enjoyed pursuant to this plan.
2. No construction planned pursuant to this Subdivision.

With the purchase of this 5.179 acre lot, the Kass property totaled 7.329 acres. The property has been sold as a 7.329 acre property several times since Kass owned it. Hill, the present Owner, wishes to sell the 5.179 acres to James Hobbs, Jr., an ad joiner. Since the previous 1998 Subdivision required it to become part of the Kass property there must again be a new subdivision plan approved to convey it to Hobbs.

The property is located in the Rural Conservation (RC) Zoning District. Freedom Township Zoning Ordinance (ZO) Section 604.A-Density States "The maximum residential density shall be one (1) dwelling unit per five (5) acres.

As the total acreage of the Hill property is 7.329 acres and there is one dwelling unit now on this property, Lot 3 (5.179 acres) or any part of Lot 3 cannot be used to construct a dwelling unit on it.

We have consulted Attorney Linus E. Fenicle and he is in agreement the following notes should be added to the Plan." The previous subdivision Plan for Lot 3, recorded in Plan Book 75, Page 40 and referred to as Lot 2 states: "Lot #2 shall be conveyed to David & Juanita Kass; owners of the adjoining parcel. It shall become a part of that parcel and may not be separately sold, conveyed, leased, used, Lot 3 is now an integral part of the Isaac P. Hill property and the total acreage of the Hill Property consists of 7.329 acres. Section 604. A of the Freedom Township Zoning Ordinance (ZO) establishes the maximum density as one (1) dwelling unit per five (5) acres. Based on this requirement, neither Lot 3 nor any part of Lot 3 may be used for a dwelling unit as there is presently one dwelling unit on the Hill property.

Other Comments: The Plan is submitted as a final plan prior to preliminary plan approval. A waiver has been requested to eliminate the need for the submittal of a preliminary plan. We recommend this waiver be granted.

1. Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance (SALDO) Section 306.A-9 -Key Map. The Key map should have road names on it.
2. SALDO §306-A-25 - The site data shows Lot 3 as agricultural and lot addition to James Hobbs, Jr. property. If any other use is proposed Freedom Township approval should be required.
3. SALDO §306-A-27 - The location of structures, well and septic system on Lot 1 should be shown.
4. SALDO §306-A-28 - Certificate of Ownership not signed.
5. The numbering of the 5.179 acre Lot as Lot 3 is confusing. There is no Lot 2. We recommend that this tract be labeled Lot 2 and all notes corrected accordingly.
6. The Township may wish to add additional conditions as to how Lot 3 can be developed.
7. A copy of the Miscellaneous Document filed in the Adams County Court House must be provided to the Township upon filing.

Dean explained that this is an AG lot and what could happen Hobbs has a trucking business and this cannot expand over to this property. The above notes will be on the plan and with both parties signing the plan they understand these conditions. Hobbs will have to abide by these conditions. Any other uses would have to be brought before the Zoning Hearing Board. This plan was received on July 28 at the County and the township on July 17, 2015. Beyond all boundaries will revise the plan to take care of Gettysburg Engineering's comments. Allen Beckett made a motion with a second by Matt Young to table the plan until the October 14, 2015 meeting giving Dean to have a chance to thoroughly review a revised. Plan. 3-0 Dean States that if approved a copy of the memorandum must be recorded within 30 days.

James Stultz Subdivision-Ken Scott of Beyond all Boundaries had also submitted the plan on the same dates to the County and to the township. The county had commented and Gettysburg Engineering. The County Comments were general comments and Gettysburg Engineering comments were James Stultz owns two (2) adjoining properties. The Subdivision is to subdivide Lot 2, 0.243 acres from the 10.398 acre property and make it part of the 1.668 acre property. The property is in the Rural Conservation (RC) Zoning District.

1. The Plan has been submitted a Final Plan. The Township must determine if a waiver should be granted to allow the plan to be submitted as a final plan before a preliminary plan is submitted. We recommend that a waiver be granted.
2. Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance (SALDO) Section 306-A-9 - requires a Key Map to be at scale of 1"=1,000'. The map is at scale of 1"=2,000'. This Map could be accepted, but the road names and graphic scale must be shown.
3. SALDO §308-4 - A note must be added that upon plan approval, the Owner must file in the Miscellaneous Docket in the Recorder of Deeds Office of Adams County a memorandum that Lot 2 shall be considered a single lot with the James Stultz property recorded in Deed Book 1083, page 49. The Supervisors may require or Stultz may desire to have a new deed written incorporating these two (2) tracts. If so, the note should be revised accordingly. Sheet 2 shows the existing sewer system on Lot 1 as a subsurface system. The system is an elevated sand mound.

NOTES TO BE ADDED:

4. If not previously dedicated, the right-of-way for Boyle and Middle Creek Roads shown hereon is offered to the Township for dedication for public use and the Township, by virtue of its approval of this plan, hereby accepts the dedicated right-of-way.

5. This parcel is in the Rural Conservation (RC) Zoning District. Section 604.A of the Freedom Township Zoning Ordinance restricts density in this Zoning District to one dwelling per five acres. Based on this restriction, the maximum number of dwelling units for this tract is two (2), since the parent tract is 10.398 acres. There is presently one dwelling unit on the tract. One additional dwelling unit is permitted on this parcel.

The Board discussed the above and Mr. Scott had presented a revised plan. Dean -of Gettysburg Engineering - stated that there are no road names on the location map. 




Dean Shultz, Ron Garis and Ed Wenschhof will be taking a trip out to the property on Natural Dam Road in order to finalize the survey.
