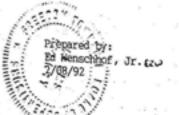

Mr. Herbert-again stressed that all of the submissions up to this point address sewage and the land development concerns will be addressed as part of Act 247 requirements. Gary Huggens asked why holding ponds were not addressed. Mr. Herbert responded. that the system has not been designed yet and he would like to include ponds. DER must approve and situate the system before it can be designed. M. Solembieski inquired about a 149,000 gallon figure that appears in the module. Mr. Mertal's indicated that the figure represents a peaking factor.

Mr. Varish discussed the fact that the Township has no control over the sewage system.
