Aug. 24, 1959

A special meeting of the Supervisors of Freedom Township was called to order for the purpose of discussing the sanitary landfill.

A letter from Attorney John Macphail was read to the Supervisors stating that he felt a public meeting would serve no good purpose because they usually end in arguments and never settle the main issues.

He also stated that he would have to be disqualified from such a meeting in as much as he had drawn up the agreement between Mr. Gordon and Mr. Flank relative to the sanitary landfill.

The Petitions were next presented to the Supervisors by the Secretary George Glenn and were discussed with the belief that most people signing have not seen the landfill in operation.

The Secretary was directed to have an item inserted in the Gettysburg Times requesting the signers of the Petitions to view the landfill operation, then decide whether it should remain in operation or not.

The Secretary was also directed to contact Attorney Cyle asking the persons whose names were responsible for the Petitions to appear before the Supervisors showing reasons for wanting the

Sanitary Landfill discontinued. It was also decided not to hold a public meeting at this time.

Paul Plank Jr. was called to the meeting and was asked questions regarding the sanitary landfill. He stated that it has been operated according to State Regulations, in that all materials being covered at the close of the days operation.

He was also asked about the rat situation and stated that to date he has seen only 5 rats and they were all killed. He also stated that he plans to buy a new truck and bulldozer for carrying on the operation if allowed to continue.

Mrs. Plank gave the Supervisors a book regarding sanitary landfill operations and how successful they have been in a number of places.

There being no further business at this time the meeting adjourned.

Mr. Fred Klunk gave his views regarding the closing of the landfill. He stated that it would contaminate Marsh Creek in due time. He stated that it would become unfit for bathing in due time. He also stated that there would be a rodent menace in due time. He stated that these were the reasons for protesting the continuation of the landfill.

Mrs. George Miller also stated she was protesting against the landfill for the same reasons.

Mr. Norman Plank, Frank Bowersox, Maurice Short and John Rohrbaugh also entered their protests against the sanitary landfill.

It was upon the motion of Fred Klunk and seconded by Kenneth Chard that a resolution be drafted to outlaw the dumping of garbage in Freedom Township.

A motion by Mr. Trussell and seconded by Mr. Lefler that a resolution be drawn up to prohibit the hauling, depositing, and accumulation of garbage, rubbish and other refuse within the boundaries of Freedom Township, Adams County, Pennsylvania, brought from without the boundaries of that Township.

A roll call vote revealed

Mr. Gordon - no

The motion carried.

A motion by Mr. Fussell and seconded by Mr. Lifter to have Attorney MacPhail start proceedings to get the \$5,00 per Capita tax that the Freedom Township School Board is now receiving. The motion was unanimously adopted.

A motion by Mr. Fussell and seconded by Mr. Lifter to have Mr. Gordon get his son Richard or whom ever he may see fit to do the work on the road. The motion carried.

A motion by Mr. Lifter that the Freedom Township Board of Supervisors can see their way clear to build the road leading from Mr. Harry Scott to the Paul Kemer farm. The motion carried.

The regular meeting of the Freedom Township Board of Road Supervisors was held at James H. Russell's with the following members present, Mr. Gordon, Mr. Russell and George Glenister present.

The minutes of the special meeting of August 24, 1959 were read and approved as read, also.

The minutes of the regular meeting of August were also read and approved as read.

Attorney John D. Thrush was present to represent Paul L. Flank Jr. in opposition to closing the landfill. Mr. Thrush presented petitions signed by a number of residents stating that the land fill was neither "unsightly, unsanitary nor objectionable," and that "it is the right and privilege of any man to conduct a business that is not injurious or objectionable to the public welfare."

The petition raised the question of establishment of a monopoly in land-fill operation as a result of ordinance preventing depositing of debris.

Attorney Oyley was also present as well as a number of signers opposing the landfill at which time Mr. James H. Russell stated that he would not sign the ordinance as it is drawn up. Mr. Oyley sign it unless some changes were made. The supervisors stated that the ordinance should not contain any clause prohibiting any resident from depositing of his or her own garbage.

Attorney Oyley sat down with the supervisors and discussed the changes with them, and stated that he would draw up a new ordinance as recommended by the supervisors.

Mrs. Miller told the supervisors that she would give them 30 days to have the new ordinance enacted.
