Call to Order

Chair Young called the Board of Supervisor's Meeting to order at 7:07 PM and announced that an executive session was held prior to the meeting to discuss potential litigation.

Approval of Minutes

Vice-Chair Kellett made a **MOTION** to approve the Minutes of the November 6, 2024, regular meeting. The **MOTION** was **SECONDED** by Chair Young. The motion carried unanimously (3-0).

Monthly Expenses

Vice-Chair Kellett made a **MOTION** to approve the bills in the amount of \$13,587.68 from the General Fund. The **MOTION** was **SECONDED** by Mr. Johnston. The motion carried unanimously (3-0).

Manager & Road Reports

Mr. Gulden read the Manager's report. The Manager completed the following tasks in November:

- Misc. phone calls / emails / website updates.
- Submitted monthly solar meter reading.
- Monthly employment tax reports and payments.
- Monthly reconciliation of all bank accounts.
- November 6th Board of Supervisor's meeting minutes.
- 2x bank deposit.

- Prepared and mailed KPI stormwater management review invoices for reimbursement.
- Enacted burn ban on November 1st and lifted on November 25th at Chairperson's direction, posted website, and notified County 911 & fire department.
- Prepared Ordinance 2025-01, supervisor salary increase option from Act 94 of 2024.
- Reached out to 2x zoning permit holders to notify them that their permits expired in November.
- Finalized and submitted Local Share Account Grant for phase 2 of the park.
- 1x zoning permit for a single-family dwelling.
- 1x well permit.
- Applied for a \$5,000 Walmart grant for phase 2 of the park.
- Worked with Liberty and Highland Townships on speed sign purchase.

- Filled potholes with 2A stones in the parking areas along Water Works Road.
- Took down election equipment, cleaned, and set up meeting room.
- Took the F-550 to Crouse Ford for a 5,000-mile service.
- Lobar sent an electrician to install a switch to operate the lights in the new addition instead of being activated by motion, which never worked correctly.
- Put the loader back on the tractor and misc. shop work.

Supervisor pay has not been increased since 1995. Salaries under the ordinance would increase from \$1,875 to \$3,145 per year. Vice-Chair Kellett stated, if reelected, he would continue to donate his salary to the Greenmount Fire Department.

They did not want the ordinance to apply for smaller fireworks displays that can be purchased in stores by residents.
