The Township hereby ordains under the authority of the Act of 1933 PL...
Section 1. Unless otherwise specified, the following words shall be construed through-out this ordinance to have the meanings indicated:
(a) Junk dealer shall include any discarded article or article such as is lawfully disposed of as rubber, tire, or refuse and shall include, but not be limited to, abandoned or scrapped motor vehicles, scrap material and salvaged goods of all kinds.
(b) Person. Shall mean any natural person, partnership, firm or corporation.
(c) Township. Shall mean Freedom Township, Adams County, Pennsylvania.
(d) Junk dealer. Shall mean any person who shall engage in the selling, buying, salvaging or storing in junk.
(e) License. Shall mean the permit issued to a junk dealer.
(f) No person shall maintain on any premises for the storage or disposal of junk nor engage in the business of a junk dealer without having obtained a license from the Board of Supervisors of Freedom Township as hereinafter provided.
Section 2. The license provided for in this ordinance shall be issued by the Board of Supervisors upon written application on forms to be provided by the Board. Each application form shall be complete in every detail, shall be accompanied by a plot plan of the premises to be used under the license and shall be accompanied by cash or cashier's or certified check in the amount of \$250.00. Licenses shall be valid for twelve (12) calendar months from date of issuance unless revoked as hereinafter provided, and must be renewed at the end of each term by...

REGULATING THE STORAGE AND ACCUMULATION OF RUBBER TYRES FOR JUNK DEALERS AND THE MAINTENANCE AND OPERATION OF JUNK DEALERS' PREMISES, AND PRESCRIBING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF; AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 1.
Freedom Township hereby ordains as follows:
Section 1. No person, association, firm or corporation shall keep or suffer to remain on his or her premises or on any private property any garbage, putrid matter, refuse, rubbish, or other offensive or unwholesome matter, or dump or deposit the same anywhere in Freedom Township, Adams County, Pennsylvania, or in streams or any other body of water within or flowing through the said township; nor may any person, association, firm or corporation use or permit to be used any lot or piece of ground within the said township as a public or private dump for garbage, putrid matter, or refuse, rubbish or other offensive or unwholesome matter unless specifically authorized by Freedom Township Board of Supervisors.
Section 2. Any person, association, firm or corporation who or which shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction thereof be sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$100.00 and costs of prosecution, and in default of payment of such fine and costs, to imprisonment for not more than 30 days. Each day's continuance of a violation shall constitute a separate offense.
