Present were all the Supervisors, Junie Reaver and Barbara Neth.

Mrs. Neth explained to the Supervisors the discrepancy between the present ordinance, which pertains to acreage under ane acre and the DER state regulations which control farm acreage over 10 acres.

As it is now the Township uses the DER requirements of no perc or sewage module requirements for agricultrual acreage over 10 acres. This 10 acres can not be further subdivided.

The township subdivision ordinace applies to one acre lots with on-site wells and sewer(septic), but as the DET rules state no perc needed for over ten acres the township farm land is being subdivided into 10 acre homesites not agricultural land with no perc required. This is breaking up prime farm land into small places that could easily become a future source of pollution requiring expensive central sewer systems.

An ordinance to require all subdivision to have sewage modules(covential shallow placement and sand mounds) and a permit to fix existing malfuntioning sewage systems was discussed.

Some of the questions raised were: Will all land pass some type of perc?
Why would a bid proposal require per? What about a preexisting sewage system which
mal-functions.

At the next meeting of the Supervisors it is hoped that the Planning commission will have some answers to the questions.

The property is over two acres and is approved for an additional septic system of the sand mound type. The concern is that the system will be too close to the rum. Dean shultz rececked the location and still feels there should be no problem. Mr. Neth stated that there is no huarantee when a system is put in it will always function. The Greenmount Fire Company represented by Ed Rothsupt and Ben Bishep stated that the Company will give one key to the township. The township will then be responsible for turning off lights and turning down the thermostat.

He stated that he felt to install 15 in cement drainpipe would not solve any drainage problems. He preferred to create swales which he felt would carry the water off the road better. The supervisors agreed. The application for road permits were granted and after inspection by the Supervisors provideing the swales meet there requirements the final permit will be granted.

The Supervisors on advise of Planning Commission agreed to study the Flood Plain Ordinance as drawn up by Mr. Campbell. It is hoped to advertise the ordinance for final passage by the March meeting.

(1) Shriver Rd. was tarred and chipped (1,000 gal. of oil); (2) Red Rock Rd. was tarred and chipped (3,000 gal. of oil); (3) Natural Dam Rd. the old surface was retarred and chipped and the hill at Cumberland Township's end has been tarred and chipped (3,500 gal. of oil); (4) Bigham Rd. the big dirt hill across from New Dawn has been tarred and chipped (1,200 gal. of oil); McGlaughlin Rd. pie crusts were treated in front of Branch's, Weakland's and Horoschak (1,250 gal. of oil); (6) Wenschoff Rd. No. 2 stones applied then oiled and chipped and tarred twice (1,250 gal. of oil); (7) Boyle Rd. has No. 2 stones applied, oiled, then tarred and chipped twice (3,700 gal. of oil) (8) Shorb Mill Rd. 42 ton of crusher rum applied for pot holes and other needed repairs; and (9) McGlaughlin Rd. small side gutters in front of Shapiro's were cleaned out.

Mr. Bigham reported that he and Mr. Mason were in contact with Mr. Angelaris's representative concerning the purchase of a three acre piece of property on the corner of Red Rock Rd. There was no discussion of price.

Mr. Mason stated that Mr. Greiber on McGlaughlin Rd. has started an adition to his house. Mr. Mason asked it a building permit has been obtainer. Mr. Neth replied "no". Since Mr. Campbell was present he as asked by Mr. Bigham what is the proper proceedure in cases like this. Mr. Campbell then stated that it is the permit officers duty to inspect any construction. If a violation has occured then the township should send a letter to the property owner who has not applied for a permit informing him that a permit is necessary in order to avoid fines and costs. If the property owner does not comply, then the township solicitor is to be notified and the correct legal steps taken to bring the property owner in compliance with the building permit ordinance.

Mr. Neth said that Martin P. Anchor asked about the mobile home on Sue Tracey's property on Gordon Rd. Mr. Neth stated he went out and inspected the trailer which is unoccupied although an electric extension cord has been run to provide lights for clean up work.

Mr. Herr made a motion to approve the spraying of gypsy moth infested areas in Freedom Township. Mr. Mason seconded the motion. If the cast is similar to this year (1983) it will paid entirely by the township. At present it is \$1.00 an acre.

Act 32 amends the Pennsylvania Vehicle code and under its provision PennDot has six month to complie a list of road to be transferred. PennDot is then to notify the municipality but no transfer of roads may occur unless the municipality agrees to accept the road. If repairs are naeded they will be done after mutual agreement. One year after the road is transferred a muncipality will begin receiving an annual maintenance payment of \$2,500 per mile of road. Such roads are not eligible for liquid fuel monies and may not be included in the liquid fuel allocation formula.

Mr. Campbell was present at the meeting for the purpose of discussing with the Supervisors the SCATCOM agreement which will need to pe passed as an ordinance. Mr. Campbell said that the 3% of gross receipts will be the fee paid by SCATCOM. Mr. Campbell included a clause in the agreement to the effect that if an exclusive agreement is declared null and void by the Congress then this agreement will be the same. After some discussion Mr. Bigham made a motion to advertise the revised ordinance for adoption at the October meeting. Mr. Mason seconded the motion.

Mr. Richard Waybright had called Mr. Neth to inquire if there was any action on his plan to add effluent from twelve houses to the methane digester. Last month the Supervisors had agreed to the action in principle. But after closer review of the presentation it was noted that a proper subdivision will need to be prepared. All roads and satback requirements will need to be meet before the resolution can be approved.

The Supervisors received a request from Attorney McQuaide representing Francis Wenschhoff. A 14.036 acre subdivision of Robert Wenschhoff had been approved by the Supervisors on August 10, 1977. Since the subdivision was never recorded within the required time the subdivision is null and void. A sylar plot of the subdivision was presented. It was requested that the present supervisors approve and sign this subdivision. Mr. Mason made a motion, seconded by Mr. Herr in which they agreed to verify that approval of the subdivision had been made August 10, 1977 as evidenced by the minutes of that meeting and signatures on the mylar plot. Motion carried.

The folling subdivisions were approved. Allen W. and Teresa G. Plank presented a subdivision on Bullfrog Road. The site is 2.5 acres on both sides of the road. The 31,388 sq. ft. (Lot 1) section with a house and septic system installed before passage of the Pa. Sewage Facilities Act is to be sold to Frank B. Jr. and Rebecca Ann Darcy with the provision that it may not be sold frank B. Jr. and Resecce and Service and to be retained by the Planks and other remainder, In the future as a separate the road to be retained by the Planks and will become an integral part of the property, and may not be sold in the future as a separate lot unless it meets all the necessary requirements. On motion of Mr. Bigham, seconded by Mr. Gordon the final subdivision was approved as presented. Motion

The subdivision of Frank B. Jr. and Rebecca Ann Darcy was approved on motion of Mr. Gordon, seconded by Mr. Bigham. Motion carried. A farm presently containing 58 acres on Bullfrog Road (LR 01025) is to be subdivided into two lots. Lot 1 has 13.391 acres, with a house and existing septic system. Lot 2 of 44 acres which remain are to be used for agricultural pruposes unless the appropriate permits are obtained and soil tests conducted.

Mason Dixon Farms presented a sketch plan for ten more homesites on Harper Hill. Water and sewage to be provided by the Corporation. The Planning Commission forwarded the New Dawn proposal to the Supervisions for consideration. The Catholic Diocese of Harrisburg proposes a package treatment plant and 29 tent sides for the camp. Present were Mrs. Christine Kellet, Mr. and Mrs. Delton Bushey appearing on behalf of Harry Scott, Mr. and Mrs. Allen Boroshak, Mr. James Bigham, Mr. and Mrs. Roy Coldsmith and Mr. Barry Singley. Mr. Neth explained that there been complaints of odors from the camp and this was referred to Dean Shultz SEG, who referred the Township directly to DER. The existing system is not satisfactory. The treatment plant is proposed due to poor soil conditions which preclude subsurface disposal of wastewater. The township citizens present had many concerns. They were: (1) The discharge of effluent into, what in the opinionnof Mr. and Mrs. Coldsmith, is a wet water flow only; (2) The possible concentration of detarged to the concentration of the concentr concentration of detergent, which is very difficult to remove, can be harmful according to Mr. Bighm's veterinarian. Mr. Bigham is an adjoining landowner through whose farm the effluent will directly flow; (3) Mr. Singley was most concerned about the type of setback proposed for the campsites and he and Mr. Coldsaith enquired if there was a camparately proposed for the campsites and he and Mr. Coldsaith enquired if there was a campground ordinance in the township; (4) Mrs. Kellet expressed her concern for the number of campers proposed at each campsite and suggested an agreement may be needed to clarify the placement of sites and number of campers at each site. of campers at each site; and (5) Mr. Singley said he was concerned about the water table. He asked where was the additional water to came from to operate the

After listening to the concerns of all those present the Board decided to return the proposal to New Dawn's engineer Michael Baker, Jr. for additional

Mr. Thomas L. Greiber, represented by his attorney Kenneth Rotz presented to the Board a 20.069 acre subdivision on McGlaughlin Road showing a horse arena, mobile home and existing septic system. Hr. Neth presented a letter he had written Mr. Greiber stating that no appropriate permits had been obtained for the mobile home or septic system. Also reasearch at the Adams County Board of Assessment shows there never was a mobile home on the tax roles for this property. The Township is in receipt of a letter from Mr. Shultz, SEO in which Mr. Greiber stated that the mobile home was on the property when it was purchased. If this is not the case and the mobile home and septic system was placed in the last several years then the plan should not be approved, continued Mr. Shults's letter.

The Planning Commission was unable to agree on the proper course of action and so referred it to the Supervisors.

Mr. Rotz stated that the mobile home with its present system was on the property when Mr. Greiber bought it from Mr. Henry Carbaugh in 1968. He presented a letter from Sally Lohman, Assistant Adams County Planner stating that in the aerial views 4-66C and 4-66D she found the following: (1) Along the right-of way, approximately 300 feet southeast of the barn (as indicated on Greiber's subdivision plan of March 2, 1984) there is an object having the approximate dimension of 10' by 35' which may be the mobile home and (2) Closer inspection with optical side does not show any greater detail because of the size of the object and the 1" -400' scale at which the photo was taken. Mr. Rotz also presented a notorized statement from James J. Stewart that he "used the trailer for a summer vacations

and periodically during the weeks"....from 1969 throught 1973. After such discussion, the Board would not approve the plan as forwarded by the Planning Commission since this was the first time it had been presented the Board of Supervisors's action. Upon the insistence of Mr. Greiber and Mr. Rotz the Board agreed to consult their solicitor, Mr. Campbell to sid them in making

The Supervisors conducted the Spring road inspection on April 16, 1984. As a result of the inspection the following road work will need to be performed. The Boyle Rd. Ext., portions of Scott, Bullfrog, McGlaughlin, Shorb Mill and Gordon Roads need to have tar and chip applied. The side gutters need to be classed on Scott, Natural Dam, Middle Creek, Rohrbaugh, Gordon, McGlaughlin, Red Rock, and Schriver Roads. Middle Creek Road needs two grates of approximately 3 x 5 feet put over open drain boxes. The brush needs to be cut back on Rohrbaugh Read and Wenschhoff Road is missing the stop sign. The potholes need to be filled on Bollinger School and Bullfrog Roads. Drain pipes need to be cleaned on Natural Dam and McClaughlin Roads. It may be necessary for a grader to be brought in for Schriver and Boyle Roads. Blasting may be needed on Natural Dam and Gordon Roads.

The Supervisors spoke with an occupant of the property on the carmer of Bullfrog and Pumping Station Roads who said that some of the vehicles may be removed. On motion of Mr. Bighau, seconded by Mr. Gordon the Secretary was directed to write a letter to the owner of the property telling him to remove the excess cars. Motion carried.

Other maters brought to the Supervisors attention were the local bridge inspection program. All bridges 20 feet or more in length are eligible for 80% federal funding. No bridges in the township were over 20 feet.

The state vishes to contract with the townships to play snow at the rate of \$670. per mile of road. The Supervisors stated that Freedom Township does not have the necessary equipment to consider the offer.

The yearly statistical summary was received from PennBot showing a 20% increase in the number of fatalities in the Township.

The fire calls for April were: (1) on April 13, 1984 a chicken house fire on Old Frederick Rd., Emmitsburg, MD: (2) on April 19, 1984 a call to the National Fire Academy where an automatic fire alarm had gone off, Emmitsburg, MD: (3) on april 24, 1984 a chimney fire at the Wood's Residence on Business Route 15, south; (4) on April 30, 1984 a call to the western auto Store in Emmitsburg, Md, for a structure fire.

The Fire calls for May were: (1) on May 1, 1984 a call to Mountain
Manor Rehabilitation Center where an automatic fire alarm had souned, Emmitsburg,
MD: (2) on May 15, 1984 a call to Emmitsburg where the automatic fire alarm had
gone off at the Lutheran Church: (3) on May 15, 1984 Mountain Manor Rehabilitation
center, an automatic fire alarm; (4) on May 27, 1984 a motorcycle accident on
Natural Dam Rd.: (5) on May 29, 1984 a chimney fire at the Price Residence on Bullfrog Rd.

No police report was received from Cumberland Township.

Mr. Bigham presented the following report for May: The snow play has been moved to Supervisors's Gordon's house. The moving of grass on township roads will begin as soon as the grass dries out. On motion of Mr. Gordon, seconded by Mr. Bigham the secretary was instructed to advertise for bids for 10,000 gallons of various road oils. Motion carried.

On Motion of Mr. Bigham, seconded by Mr. Gordon the preliminary and final subdivision plan of Mrs. Kellet on Gordon Road was approved. The approval is continguent upon final approval of DER in regard to the sewage modules. The subdivision contains three lots. Lot 1, on the western end of the subdivision contains 10.000 acres; Lot 2 with the existing house and septic system on the easterly end scontains 10.073 acres and the rear piece Lot 3, contains 28.807 acres with two, fifty feet panhandles on Gordon Road. Motion carried.

Mrs. Kellet was advised by Mr. Bigham that road occupancy permits will be needed by the the four dirveways. The Township will place the pipe and the Kellet's will be billed.

Mr. . W. Békelja, facilities engineer for the Diocese of Harrisburg appeared to answer questions form concerned citizens and Supervisors. Mr. Bekelja gave a brief history of events which led up to the presentation of a sweage disposal plan to the township. He said that the primitive septic system which is presently malfunctioning permits no additional persons. to be served at the camp. Probe holes were dug at various locations but all failed. The only solution to the present problem is a package sewage plant. The proposed plant would have a capacity of 8,000 gallons a day to accommante 125 persons, the present capacity of the camp. The original plan was to discharge the effluent into the lake since the affluent will be 95% clean but DER would not approve this plan. The effluent is planned to be discharged into the wet whentherstream at the base of the lake dam. DER is aware that the stream is a wet weather stream only. The proposes plant is a tertiary system which produces the cleanest effluent. Mr. Bekerja again reinterrated that the camp is not incended for year round use and there will be no additional staff or campers. The twenty-nine tent sits have now been eliminated from the proposed plan.

The public were then invited to ask questions. Mrs.Chicemith, asked if DAR was aware that the effluent discharged would go into a wet wheather stream only? Mr. Bakelja replied yes DER had specified the location of the discharge.

Mr. Mason asked where was the additional water to come from for the operation of the package plant and would it affect the water table? Mr. Bekelja said no additional water is needed since the number served would remain the same(125) also, the pond or lake could serve as a reservoir if needed.

Mr. Tullsi asked for a clarification of the location of the planned campaites. Mr. Bekelja replied there is only one suitable site that is level enough and close enough to the proposed bathhouse. It is to the rear of the present cables.

Mr. Coldsmith questioned the distance of the campaites to the neighbors. Hr. Beklepja said that the contour of the land limits the placements of campaites and the distance to the proposed bathhouse must be taken into

Mr. Tuliai asked if the planned activities are part of the services provided by the Diocese. He was told that some of the groups bring their own activity directory and others depend upon the services of the Dioceso.

Mr. Bekelja said that the proposed system would cost approximately \$75,000. and it will be a tertiery plant which will produce effluent 95% pure.

The citizens present agree that the proposed plant is needed but assurance are necessary that the discharge will not harm cattle. They are very concerned about the number of persons served. Mr. Bekelja said the feasibility study certifies to DER that the plant will serve only 125 persons. The citizens wished absolute guarantees of the purity of the effluent. Mr. Neth replied that there is never absolute security about anything.

Mr. Campbell, township solicitor, said that the Pennsylvania sewage Facilities Act is abused at times but no guarantees are ever given. The type of sewage plant proposed means that the SEO and Supervisors will have virtually no authority over the plan. Mr. Campbell advised the citizens to address their concerns to DER and their state representatives and senators. DER will monitor the plant but at the same time DER sometimes does not cooperate with enforcement by local officials.

Mr. Mason made a motion, seconded by Mr. Bigham that a revised plan be subm mitted to the township. The revised plan to have a map removing the tent sites stating the type of sewage plant planned and the number of persons served. Motion carried. A copy of the feasibility study was also requested by the Supervisors.

Mr. Francis (JIM) Wenschhof appeared before the Board to ask for a solution to his proplem of an illegal septic system at his house on Bullfrog Road.

Mr. Campbell addressed the problem as follows: A house was erected without a proper building permit, a septic system was constructed with no permit, a subdivision was not recorded within the 90 day limit, voiding the subdivision. The subdivision was altered deliberately and then presented to the Supervisors for re-approval.

A letter form Dean Shultz, SEO was presented. In it he stated that the house appears to have some type of system but the area of the probe holes is unsuitable for any type of sytem including an elevated sandmound.

It was suggested to Mr. Wenschhof that under the circumstances he: (1) pure chase additional land; (2) install a holding tank if state approval can be obtained; or (3) additional probe holes could be dug in a different location.

On motion of Mr. Mason, seconded by Mr. Sigham a letter will be sent to
Dean Shultz, SEO asking for the direction of actions as to the legality and feasibility
of a holding tank or if there is an alternative system available; if additional
land can be purchased. Mr Mason voted sye. Mr. Bigham voted age. Mr. Gordon,
voted age.

On motion of Mr. Bigham seconded by Mr. Mason the decision to whether fine Mr. Wenschoff or prosecute for the illegal system will be tabled until next meeting. Mr. Mason voted aye. Mr. Bigham voted aye. Mr. Gordon voted aye.

Mr. Bigham made a motion, seconded by Mr. Mason to table the decision on wheter to prosecute Mr. Robert Wenschhoftfor a subdivision violation until a vectorendation is received from Dean Shultz. Mr. Mason voted aye. Mr. Bigham voted aye. Mr. Gordon voted aye.

Mr. Mason made a motion seconded by Mr. Bigham to direct the solicitor Mr. Campbell to take appropriate action to file charges against Mr. Prancis (Jim) Wenschhof for violation of the building permit ordinance. Mr. Mason woted aye. Mr. Bigham woted aye. Mr. Gordon voted aye.

Mr. Greiber's proposed 20 acre subdivision on McGlaughlin Road was denied approval. On motion of mr. Bigham, seconded by Mr. Mason the proposed preliminary and final subdivision was denied because the plan shows an existing illegal mobile home and septic system for which no building permit or see agreement were obtained. Mr. Mason voted aye. Mr. Bigham voted aye. Mr. Gordon voted aye. The proposed plan may be approved after the proper permits are obtained by Mr. Greiber.

Mason Dixon Farms sketch plan for 12 additional homesites on Harpers's Hill was denied approval. In the discussion the Supervisors agreed with the concept of using land not suitable for farming for residential use but all agreed that the subdivision ordinance requirement must be met. On motion of Mr. Bigham, seconded by Mr. Gordon the sketch plan was denied because the plan as presented violated many if not all sections of the Freedom Township Subdivision and Land Use Ordinance. Mr. Mason voted aye. Mr. Bigham voted aye. Mr. Gordon voted aye. The areas of concern were the slope of the lots and roads, the double lots and the lack scale to name a few.

The need for a backhoe/loader was discussed by the Supervisors. The number of dirt roads in the township requires constant maintence of side gutters. The installation of driveway pipe also require hiring a loader frequently. On motion of Mr. Mason, seconded by Mr. Gordon it was voted to investigate purchasing a used tractor/loader from James Bigham to replace the Oliver tractor now in use. Mr. Mason voted aye. Mr. Gordon voted aye. Mr. Bigham abstained.

Under new business Mrs. Neth presented a letter about a Seal Coat Workshop to be held June 90, 1984 in Harrisburg at the cost of \$15.00 per person. None of the Supervisors were able to attend due to conflicts.

The Adams County Earned Income Tax Collection Agency Budget for 1985 was presented. The only area of increase was postage. The Supervisors accepted the budget as presented.

The Surplus Sampler which had an article on creative reuse of surplus federal and state property was scanned by the Supervisors.

A bulletin on "Curb cuts" was presented by the Pennsylvania disabled Veteralns. It gave information on the proper prodeedure for instally handicapped curb access.

The meeting adjourned at 11:15 P.M.

Mrs. McClay a member of the Adams County Library Board of Trustees requested support for the library. The Adams County Library budget for 1984 was \$ 247,000. Which is only \$ 3.62 per Adams County Resident. The Supervisors will be considering the budget next month.

Mr. C. M. Bar kley of College Park, MD is proposes to start a pig farm on acreage on eith side of Shorb Mill Poad. Mr. Barkley is contemplating a feed lot type operation in which the pigs will be confined to sheds and feed for market. Mr. Bigham presented the following report for December: The snow plow and spreader have been installed on the truck. Repair work for the truck is estimated to be \$2,500. The brakes, carburetor, vacuum unit, tuneup will be the major items on the bill. The Oliver tractor is at the dealers under cover for the winter. Mr. Bigham asked if the Supervisors agreed to bid the Massey Ferguson for sale in March for the Bids to be opened in April. The other Supervisors agreed.

The Greenmount Fire Company presented the following report for 1984. The Company responded to a total of 69 calls of which 21 were in Preedom Township, 18 calls in Cumberland Township, 25 calls in Maryland, 1 call in Liberty Township, 1 call in Fairfield Boror and 2 calls in Highland Township. There were 25 reported structure fires, 13 assists to Emmitsburg, 2 assists to barlow and 4 assists to Fairfield. There were 12 vehicle accidents, 9 chimney fires, 2 car fires, 6 A.D.T. alarms, 4 stand-by's and 11 miscellaneous calls. An average of 14 members responded per call. The trucks spent approximately 80 hours on calls and the estimated fire loss in our first major sercie area, excluding auto accidents was \$19,660. The Companys also purchased 1,000 feet of new 3" hose.

Rev. and Mrs. Crowley members of the Board of Directors of Summit Lake Camp located in Maryland appeared before the Township Supervisors to explain their plans for another church camp to be located in Freedom and Liberty Townships. The proposed camp will be patterned after the present one. The Crowley's stressed that the camp provides an interdenominational ministry which has been used in the past by over 500 different denominations. The group which uses the facilities must provide a structured program for participants in addition to no smoking inside buildings and no drinking allowed at all.

The new facility will be on a total of 460 acres if the land acquisition is successful. With this large an area they should be able to accommanded 600 to 1000 persons at a session. The sewage facility plan is being designed and all state and federal regulations will be adhered to. Most of the campers will arrive by bus and some will come by private car. Full operation is four to five years away but the present plans call for site deveiplment as soon as possible.

The Supervisors lisened attentively to the Crowley's and were interested in the plans for site development in regard to the entrance and exit plans as they will affect township roads. The sewage question was explored as to whether they were planning sand mounds or package sewage plans. The Crowley's said for now they hope to have a sand mound system. The Supervisors asked to be keep informed of the plans and developments for the camp.

Mr. Aubrey Marcus asked if the pipe that had been removed from his driveway on McGlaughlin Road could be reused but the Supervisors feel that the pipe was too small to begin with and it would be necessary to replace it very shorly since it is likely to clog with debris. The Board policy in the past has been to install 14" concrete pipe in 6ft. sections. The approximate cost of the pipe is \$175.00. The area to be developmed will have sewage through a methane digester. If, in the future, the methane digester servicing the residential sites ever stops operation on a permanent basis, Mason Dixon Farms, Inc. or its successors must re-submit and application to Freedom Township and to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for approval of an alternate sever system on the area herein reserved. Legend on the cross hatched area of plat to read: Area reserved for water source and for water disposal system if methane digester unable tosarvice or not available to service the residental ites."

This is substantially the wording that was agreed upon at the December 12, 1984 meeting but until a complete plan is submitted the Supervisors did not vote to accept or deny this request.

Philip O. Neth, Secretary asked if the Supervisors had any objection to changing the Township, State, and Revenue Sharing accounts into money market funds since they pay a better rate of interest. The Supervisors agreed to this plan.

John Bigham, Roadmaster presented the following report for January: The majority of the time was spent plowing and spreading enti-skid. The cost of anti-skid used to date is approximately \$1,000. Cumberland Township is ordering a new cutting edge for the snow plow at a cost of about \$150. John Bigham inspected the roads to examine the damage done by the weather. Bighan and Scott Roads will need stone. Boyle Road need safety rails and Shorb's Mill Road had an ice jam at the bridge. Mr. Reaver appeared before the Board to explain the bill for the dump truck and to say that approximately \$1,500 is still needed to put the truck in first class shape. The Supervisors agreed that a new truck would cost at least \$30,000 plus interest and the repair bill is small in comparison. Mr. Harner has orfered to purchase the cld snow blade for \$250. The Supervisors agreed to sell it for that price. Mr. Bigham will give Mr. Campbell the specifications for the five foot side-mounted mower. The mower is expected to cost between \$4,000 and \$4,200. They also want to sell the Massey Ferguson for about \$4,000. So the Township will almost trade even and have very little outlay for the new equipment. Mrs. Neth informed the Supervisors that the state has asked that road occupancy permits be issued before a building permit since if there is no access to the property a building permit is useless.

A resolution to retain Gettysburg Engineering as Sewage Enforcement Officer and to keep the same fee schedule for 1985 was made by Mr. Bigham, seconded by Mr. Gordon. Motion carried.

The application for errors and ommission insurance was signed by Mr. Mason.

The Planning Module for sewage for Middle Creek Bible Conference was discussed. The camp will have Ill acres in Freedom and 360 acres in Liberty Township. Since Liberty had made no decision, Freedom delayed their decision until Liberty's is known. The Church wishes to put collection lines across the Freedom Township portion of the land and run the sewage to a plant to be constructed along Middle Creek. The treated afluent flow downstream through Freedom Township. Freedom Township is concerned about the location of the plant in a flood plain and the quality of the treated afluent to be discharged into the stream.

Mrs. Neth handed out the Ethic Act Information Forms. They must be filed by each elected official and for the year after an official leaves office.

The preliminary and final plan of Chester Chapman of a 3.001 acre subdivision on Old Route 15 south of the Rt. 15 bridge was approved on motion of Mr. Bigham, seconded by Mr. Gordon. Motion carried. The piece of property has a 12 x 60 mobile home with an existing saptic system.

John W. Purdy was appointed to the Planning Commission to fill the unexpired term of Stephen DeRiggs who resigned. Mr. Furdy's term will expire December 31, 1986. The motion was made by Mr. Gordon, seconded by Mr. Dighas. Matica carried.

The Mason Dixon Dixon sewage module was approved on motion of Mr. Bigham, seconded by Mr. Gordon. Motion carried. The ledgend on the plot plan is in the form agreed upon at last months meeting. The sewage module will be forwarded to D.E.R.

Dr. Ohl, according to Bon Mason, may be interested in selling a piece of property to the Township for a building to store Township equipment. The Township equipment will have to be removed from Mr. Gordon's farm since it was sold and closing will be March 3, 1985.

Mr. Campbell was present at the meeting to present the revised campground ordinance with provisions for campgire control but after hearing the discussion regarding Middle Croek Mr. Campbell and Mr. Shults fult that the ordinance will need further revision before it will need the need of the the Township to protect its citizens. The Supervisors agreed to delay any action until the revisions are made.

The Township has received information on a number of items of interest since the last meeting. They are: The Department of Community Affairs, Bureau of Recreation and Conservation has funds available in the form of a grant for projects to acquire, develop and rehabilitate public park and recreation lands and facitlities. No interest was shown in the grant program.

A copy of the Pennsylvania Local Government Financial Statistics for 1981 was received and shared with the Supervisors. Cleveland Brothers had sent a letter with a fee schedule for rental of most commonly used heavy equipment. The 3.P.C.A. sent a copy of their newsletter. The Mans County Conservation District sent a letter to inform the Supervisors that crown vetch seed to available this year. In the past the Township has not used the seed because if it is allowed to go wild it is impossible to control.

Mr. Bigham annumced that he will be unable to contitue to serve as Supervisors since he is nowing form the Township. For submitted his resignation with regret. The remaining Supervisors will hold a Vacarcy Poard meeting within thirty days to appoint a successor to the Bigham. Mr. Bigham. They expressed appreciation for all the work Mr. Bigham has performed and asked if he would be willing to serve as Roadmaster to which he agreed.

Bill Hill, Engineer representing Middle Creek Bible Conference was present for the second time to seek township approval of the Sewage Planning Module for the proposed sever lines to be constructed in Freedom Township. The line is to connect to the plant to be constructed in Liberty Township. At the February meeting the plan was tabled until more input could be received from township residents and advisors.

Mr. Helvin Chapman, a township resident, asked if the Supervisors had seen a large map of the proposed recreation area. The site is proposed to have a saull lake with fishing, boating and bathing area. The plan also calls for a R. V. site with wash houses and bathing facilities. An activity area is planned,

Mr. Chapman asked if the Camp is to be used year round. Part of the facility will be was Supervisor Mason's reply.

Mr. Tullai, a township resident, asked for clarification. He asked if the township was approving the campground or just the placement of the sewer lines. Mr. Campbell, township solicitor said no just the sever lines to cross Freedom Township were being considered for approval.

Mr. Mason and Mr. Campbell discussed the fact that the Camp will need to seek township approval for placement of the proposed recreational areas and any actual construction in the future, and Mr. Campbell emphasized that the township approval of the sewer line concept is necessary in order to present the Sewage Planning Module to D. E. R. for acceptance or rejection. Mr. Mason explained to the township residents present that the Supervisors can find no existing reason to deny the Middle Creek Bible Conference approval of its sewage module.

Hr. Mason then made the following motion: I move to approve submission of the Sewage Planning Module from Michile Creek Bible Congerence subject to the following conditions to be inserted in the resolution to be submitted to D.E.R.



- 1. The Township has no objection to the proposal to construct sever lines from facilities to be be developed in Freedom Township to the Treatment Plant. However, if the Module is approved, Middle Creek Bible Congerence must have an approved Land Deviolpment Plan meeting Freedom Township's Subdivision & land Development Requirements prior to the start of any construction in Freedom Township and must, in addition, comply with any Flood Plain Ordinance or Campground Ordinance in effect in the Township.
- 2. Freedom Township is concerned about the adverse effect the discharge of effluent to this small streat will have on its waters, and because the stream is a trout stream, used for livestock watering, and discharges to the Chesapeake Bay, the Township is requesting that the Department establish discharge and operation requirement os the magnitude that will prohibit the pollution of this steam. When the resolution has been prepared the Township Supervisors authorize the Township Secretary to sign and forward the resolution to D.E.R. Motion seconded by Mr. Gordon. Mr. Mason voted aye; Mr. Gordon voted aye; Mr. Horschak voted aye. Motion carried.

Mr. Gordon made a motion to hire Mr. Bigham as Roadmaster-Foreman at wages of \$ 6.25 an hour. Mr. Gordon seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Mr. Bigham presented the following road report. He inspected the roads after the wind storm but found almost no damage. At presnt it looks if there will be little winter damage. The truck is mechanically very good and it runs like a new truck but the bed and spreader need to be rebuilt. Mr. Bigham asked the Supervisors if they will authorize a work order for a culvert to be replaced at the Gilbert property on Natural Dam Rd. Middle Creek Rd. at the bend needed guard rails and 2X6 boards were purchased and the guard rails installed.

Mr. Mason remided the Supervisors that the Spring road inspection is needed. They agreed to meet on Saturday March 23, 1985 and inspect the roads.

The Campground ordinance that has been in the preparation for a long time was presented by Mr. Campbell for Supervisors approval. After discussion of alchol control and noise control it was decided to vote on the Ordinance as presented. Mr. Horoschak made a motion to approve the Campground Ordinance and Mr. Gordon seconded the motion. Mr. Mason voted aye; Mr. Gordon voted aye; Mr. Horschak voted aye. Motion carried.

The Greenmount Pire Company requested that the Township pay for two of it's members to attend a D.C.A. workshop on Financial Aid for Fire Companies. On Motion of Mr. Gordon, seconded by Mr. Horoschak the approval was given for a check in the amount of \$20.00 to be issued to cover the cost of the tution.

The Adams County Planning Commission had sent a letter a few months ago asking for financial help in the preparation of a Solid Waste Management Plan. Mr. Gordon made a motion, seconded by Mr. Horoschak to contribute \$119.00 as Freedom Township's share of the cost of the plan. Motion carried.

Billy Brent, Liberty Township Supervisor asked if Freedom Township had considered passing a ten ton limit on Bullfrog Rd. He explained that an ordinance would be need to be passed by hamiton, liberty, and freedom to make the weight limit uniform along the length of the road. The Supervisors agreed that they had no objections to studying the matter.

Mr. Simon Tullai, Emergency Management Director, advised the Supervisors that he had appointed Barry Singley as Assistant Director.

A preliminary and fiant subdivision plan of Andrew T. Shorb was presented to the Supervisors for approval. Mr. Andrew T. Shorb wishes to convey 6.7247 acres to his son James R. and his wife Joanne M. Shorb. The younger Shorb's own a 1.35 acre piece with no road access but only right away access. The subdivision will give them access to Middle Creed Rd. On motion of Mr. Gordon, seconded by Mr. Horoschak the subdivision was approved as presented.

The Greenmount Fire Company presented the following report for the period of March 13, 1985 thru April 9, 1985: There were two standbys at Emmitsburg: 2 auto accidents on U. S. 15 north; 1 auto accident on Cunningham Road; an assist to Barlow on a chimney fire; a chimney fire at the Neth residence on Chapel Road; an investigation with Emmitsburg on Old Frederick Road; 2 A.D.T. alarms at the National Fire Academy; reported to a barn fire on Dry Bridge Road in Frederick County which was a false alarm; and a dust collector fire at Gettysburg Foundry.

The Greenmount Fire Company also purchased a used ambulance to be converted to a service truck. Engine 23 is out of service until repairs are completed. Todd Green and Ben Bishop attended the workshop in Lewisburg and thanked the Township for providing the tuition fees.

The Cumberland Township Police Department presented the following report for March, 1985. There were 9 calls of which there was 1 theft, 1 domestic; 1 escort to the bank; 3 motor vehicle accidents; 2 motorist assistance; and 1 abandoned vehicle.

During March the Supervisors conducted the Spring road inspection as mandated by the code for second class townships. The side gutters need to be cleaned on McGlaughlin, Bigham and Red Rock Roads for which the township backhoe will be adequate but the sidegutters on Scott, Bullfrog, Middle Creek, Wenschoff, Rohrbaugh and Boyle Roads may need outside contractors.

Tar and chip needs to be applied to McGlaughlin, Bigham, Shriver, Gordon, Shorb Mill, Dawn, Natural Dam and Bullfrog Roads. Brush needs to be cut and burned on Covered Bridge and Rohrbaugh Roads. Potholes need to be filled on Shriver, McGlaughlin, Gordon, Rohrbaugh, Shorb Mill and Natural Dam Roads.

Guard rails need to be erected on Middle Creek and Bowle Roads. The plan for the large culvert that will need to be built over Plum Rum on McGlaughlin Road are being prepared by Dean Shultz. The Supervisors will bid this project since it is going to be very involved. There is a bridge on hoerner Road which needs attention but first the township needs to determine who is responsible for the project.

The Township needs to install pipe in the following residents driveways:

Mr. Neth reported that it had been brought to his attention that Mr. Branch on McGlaughlin Road had his septic system repaired without obtaining a proper permit. The Supervisors directed that a letter be written informing him that he needs to comply with the township ordinances and obtain a permit.

The Supervisors directed that a stongly worded letter be sent to Mr. Garnett informing him he must comply with Township ordinances or face possible prosecution.

Alan Horoschak who attended the Adams County Solid Waste Management meeting on March 23, 1985 reported that the meeting was poorly attended and that Lewis Hillard of Union Township was elected Chairman. He wished to impress upon the Supervisors that Adams County will rum out of space for solid waste disposal in five years. There is a proposal to bid a study for waste management needs and practices.

Timely informational publications from Representative Donald Door, Natat's National Community Reporter, a public suction announcement by Service Supply, Moving Forward, PSATS Newsletter, DCA Partners in Progress, Pa. Surplus Sampler was shared with the Supervisors.

Mr. Neth reported than Mr. Branch had applied for and paid for a Township Sewage Permit. He replaced a colasped metal septic tank. The purpose of the fee is to reimburse the township for the cost of inspection and enforcement.

Mr. Garnett has sent the township a letter in reply to the Township letter dated April 14, 1985 which takes issue with the Township interpretation of Ordinance 81-1. The Township feels that the strict interpretation of the language in the ordinance requires Mr. Garnett to obtain a permit from Dean Shultz, S.E.O.

Mr. Neth then related to the Supervisors the history of the problem to date.

Mr. Garnett had made application to the S.E.O. for a permit and promised to pay when
Dean Shultz went out to his property. Mr. Garnett then reneged on his promise to pay

A copy of a letter from the Soil Conservation Service was read dated December 3, 1983 which recommended a 25% larger field then was usual since the slope is quite steep. The letter will be attached to the file copy. The Freedom Township Planning Commission voted in favor of the subdivision and forwarded it to the Supervisors for their action. On motion of Mr. Horoschak, seconded by Mr. Gordon the preliminary plan was approved. Motion carried.

Mr. Wadell, accompanied by Larry Bekelja facility engineer for the Diocese of Harrisburg appeared about obtaining a building permit for a 12' x 18' replacement storage shed at the pool and a permit for a new 19' x 31' cabin to house staff. The Supervisors were concerned about the additional sewage that would be generated. Generated since the new sand mound system is designed for only 7,000 gallons a day. At the suggestion of Dean Shultz a meter to monitor the flow was installed. The Greenmount Fire Company presented the following report from April 9, 1985 through May 14, 1985. There were six calls; (1) April 11, a chimney fire at Marsh Creek Heights; (2) April 12, a stand-by for Company 22 at Barlow; (3) April 14, a smoke detector activation at 130 W. Main St., Emmitsburg, MD; (4) April 19, a brush fire on Pumping Station Rd., (5) May 5, an unknown type of fire on Old Frederick Rd., Emmitsburg, MD; and (6) May 10, an unknown type of fire on Chapel Rd.

From May 14, 1985 through June 11, 1985 the Greenwount Fire Company responded to three calls. They were: (1) May 30, an auto accident which was a false slarm; (2) June 3, a building collaspe in Esmitaburg, MD; and (3) June 5, a controlled burning.

Roadmaster John M. Bigham presented the following road report for May. All the dirt roads were graded by Cumberland Township at a rate of \$18.00 per hour. The following roads were worked on for side gutter clean out and bank removal. They were Bigham Rd., McGlaughlin Rd., Middle Creek Rd., Boyle Rd., and Bullfrog Rd. Natural Dam Rd., McGlaughlin Rd. and Shriver Rd. were partially stoned. Bigham Rd. and McGlaughlin Rd., have been moved with the new mover.

For future maintenance the township will need to place pipe at the intersection of Cunningham and Shriver Roads. This intersection, per the state is township responsibility. It will be necessary to retar and chip the surfaces of those roads started last year. Pipes need to be put in on Natural Dam Rd. at the Gilbert driveway and on Gordon Rd. at the Kellett and Gordon driveways.

Discussion is needed on the McGlaughlin Rd. large pipe project. The dump truck bed is in need of repair and Lloyd Reaver can give an idea on the cost of the work needed.

The Township secretary was directed to place an advertisement in the paper for road oil in the same quantity as last year.

Mr. Robert R. Garnett who lives on Red Rock Road was present in response to a letter Mr. Mason had sent him. Mr. Garnett stated that he felt he had been mislead by Mr. Shultz. He disputes the need for a permit after reading the ordinance and he feels he doesn't need a permit.

The Planning Commission presented the following preliminary and final plans to the township for approval. Richard E. Varish wishes to subdivide a 38 acre to the township for approval. One tract to contain 2.544 acres to be tract on Bullfrog Rd. into two tracts. One tract to contain 36 acres, transferred to his daughter and her husband and the remainder to contain 36 acres.

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The Adams County Planning Commission had one reservation. Since the driveway to the property may be on a curve the state may not issue a driveway permit. Mr. Reed the future owner has already obtained a permit from PennDot for a driveway. On motion of Mr. Horoschak, seconded by Mr. Gordon the subdivision was approved subject to the completed sewage module application being submitted and approved by D.E.R. Motion carried.

The second subdivision presented by the Planning Commission was the Gordon Estate subdivision. A one lot subdivision of 20.005 acres on the corner of Gordon and Bullfrog Roads which is 'L' shaped and goes behind the existing house is to be sold to Ernest Shriver. The notation on the subdivision notes that Lot 2 (20 acres) is for agricultural use only and that prior to any construction and or land development on Lot 2, the applicable permits must be obtained and soil tests conducted if necessary. On motion of Mr. Horoschak, seconded by Mr. Mason the subdivision was approved as presented. Motion carried.

The third subdivision is a seven lot subdivision of Harold J. and Victoria Greenlee at the intersection of Bullfrog and Pumping Station Roads. All the lots meet the one acre minimum and have the appropriate soil and sewage modules. On motion of Horoschak seconded by Mr. Gordon the subdivision was approved as presented. Motion carried.

Mrs. Kellett had approached the Planning Commission a few months ago with a sketch plan for an approximate two acre subdivision containing a pond. It will reate an irregularly shaped lot which in actual practice may cause some problems but there aren't any prhohibitions in the subdivision ordinance. The Planning Commission has given preliminary approval to the proposed subdivision.

Mr. Campbell had sent an amendment to the Campground Ordinance 85-1. It redefines a campground and organized camp. It has provision for a register of campers to be kept. Only one question was raised and that was the five or more consecutive days phrase used to define an organized camp. It will be referred to Mr. Campbell to see if the time provision is necessary.

There being no further business the meeting was adjourned at 10:00 P.M. The next meeting will be held July 10, 1985.
