The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on November 6, 2003. All Supervisors were present. Also present were secretary, Joyce Shindledecker and road superintendent, Edward Wenschhof. Public in attendance were Esther Langley, Thomas Wolf, Planning Board Member, Terry Weitzel, Lloyd Reaver and Times reporter, Beth Kanagy.

Matt Young called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. Samuel Brewer made a motion to approve the minutes of October 9, 2002. Richard Varish made a second to the motion. 3-0.

Matt Young made a motion to approve the financial statement as submitted by the secretary. Samuel Brewer made a second to the motion. 3-0.

public Comment: Lloyd Reaver was concerned that trucks were encroaching on a private driveway off Cunningham Road (referred to by some residents as Dick's Lane). This private driveway is an entrance to Jay Lynn, Michael Golden (subdivisions from the Lloyd Reaver property) and Mr. Rosensteel's (formerly owned by Howard Dick and Keith Dick respectively) homes. These residents have continually asked the drivers of the vehicles to refrain from using the private driveway. The private driveway signs posted by these residents have been ignored.

Lloyd Reaver and Terry Weitzel questioned the Board of Supervisors on a subdivision entrance off Pumping Station road called Irene Lane. The men questioned if a third lot (from subdivision submitted by Bradley Yohe) had a right away off Irene Lane. The Board stated this was a fact. Joyce presented the Rainer Adams final subdivision previously brought to the board as a preliminary plan. The developer has met all of the requests of the board with the exception of the developer providing a copy of the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) permit for construction of the driveway across the wetlands. The developer was not present for the meeting. Matt Young proceeded to make a motion to approve the subdivision contingent upon receiving the DEP permit. Richard Varish made a second to the motion. 3-0

Driveway parking area paving-Joyce stated that the board had received 5 responses to the bidding to pave the driveway/parking area at the township building. 2003 Budget-Joyce prepared a tentative 2003 budget for the township. The board reviewed the budget, which includes the township being on-line for the year 2003. Minutes of Supervisors Meeting February 12, 2003

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors met on Wednesday, February 12, 2003 at 8:00 p.m. to hold their monthly meeting.

Samuel Brewer made a motion to accept the minutes of the January 6 and January 15, 2003 minutes. Richard Varish made a second to the motion. 3-0

Richard Varish made a motion to accept the financial report of January 15-February 12, 2003. Brewer made a second to the motion. Matt asked Joyce about Greg Yohe (no receipts reported, this was an error the name was not deleted). Approved 3-0.

No public comment

Road report-submitted by Edward Wenschhof –Sam Brewer read the road report. Ed and Mike plowed and cindered the roads during two snowfalls. They also changed the plow edges on both snowplows. Total gross labor for the period was \$437.55.

Secretary Report- Sgt. Lauer of the Pa. State police force gave a report on 2002 incidents in Freedom Township. Sgt. Lauer stated that the State Police are the primary Police Department for Freedom Township. He reported that there were 29 accidents and DUI related cases. There were 28 criminal and felony cases. There were 78 other cases such as removing dead animals on the roadways and false alarms. This calculated to one incident every two days. Sgt. Lauer asked for questions. Tom Wolf asked Sgt. Lauer if the State Police had investigated the incident at a residence Pumping Station Road and if issues had been resolved. The Sgt. stated that you (the public) would not hear about any juvenile charges. He stated that some charges are pending in the courts. He stated he did not think that the provider of the alcohol (case) had gone to court as of this date. Tom Wolf asked about steps in preventing this from happening in the future. Sgt. Lauer stated that prevention starts in the home. He stated that you need a warrant to enter a house, you just can't go into anyone's home. Wolf asked about punishment for juveniles. Sgt. Lauer stated that there would be no jail time. There is a 90-day suspension of a driver's license on a first offense and one year for a second offense. Sgt. Lauer stated that the State Police could be reached anytime.

Gettysburg Auto Auction/Kenneth Stake Zoning issues-Joyce Shindledecker reported that there was still no court decision handed down from the judge in either case. In checking with Attorney Linus Fenicle this case could take months before a decision is made.

Gloryridge-Joyce reported that following last month's meeting, Dean Shultz (as instructed by the Supervisors) sent out an enforcement notice to Gloryridge at Gettysburg, Terry Harner, Partner and Shawn Cassidy, Partner o/o Juanita Harner and New Dawn o/o Catholic Social Service. The notice was dated January 24, 2003. In notice, Shultz stated that the property at Camp Gettysburg Road must be brought into conformance with the Township Ordinance. This must be done by having all individuals

out of the cabins within thirty days from the date of the letter and cease the use of the property in the manner used; which is housing individuals temporarily. The only other recourse is to appeal to the Zoning Hearing Board.

Planning Commission Meeting-Joyce stated the Planning Commission Board would meet on March 5, 2003 at 7:00 p.m. to re-organize and to hold a meeting. The meeting notice will not be published. (A meeting publication was posted in the Gettysburg Times in January for the year, as the first Wednesday of the month unless a "No Meeting" sign is posted at the township office.) Basset Hound Club of America-Joyce stated that she had received a phone care from Linda Gonzalez Chairperson for the club. An event will be hod at the Yingling farm at 915 Pumping Station road on October 3-4, 2003. The test will involve between 8-10 dogs. The will be as many handlers for the dogs. The follow-up letter (requested by the secretary) states that the dogs are on leashes at all times and non-exhibitors are invited to view the event. Normally there are 10 to fifteen spectators per Gonzalez's letter. Matt asked Joyce to send a letter to Ms. Gonzalez stating that permits are required if an event anticipates 200 spectators or more.

Bradley Yohe-stabilized livestock crossing- The Natural Resources Conservation Service (specifically, Dean Shank) notified the secretary via mail that Mr. Yohe proposed to make application to the Pa DEP for installation of a livestock crossing under general permit #6. The work will be done sometime in the month of June. The location is 1700 Pumping Station Road, Fairfield, Pa on an unnamed tributary of Plum Run at the Yohe residence.

John Lloyd-Sketch Plan-John Lloyd has submitted an 11 lot sketch subdivision plan. The Planning Board reviewed the plan at it's May 7, 2003 meeting. Mr. Lloyd noted that he had made provision to access his farm with two private gravel roads one receiving access from Cunningham Road and the other form Schriver Road. He also notes that each private lane is designed to facilitate what will eventually be 3separate residences. A letter of comment was sent to the Board from Dean Shultz. The Planning Board agrees with the 6 items mentioned in Dean's letter.

- The plan shows two private roads. Private roads are not permitted under the Subdivision Ord. A variance from the Supervisors must be secured to sell lots along a private road. The Planning Commission Board agreed that private roads are not permitted.
- Dean commented that some of the lots are very odd shaped, marrow, and have
 excessive width to length ratios. The Planning Board noted on page 36 section 407a.c of The SDLDO that the depth of lots hall be not less than I nor more than two and
 one-half times their width.
- 3. Dean commented that a wetlands delineation will be necessary for lots having hydric soils.
- Dean stated that if any driveways or development is proposed in the flood plain or wetlands, a permit form DEP or ACCD is required.

All driveways must be located to allow for proper sight distance.

5. All of the groundwater with respect to nitrogen may be required.
6. A hydrologic study of the groundwater with respect to nitrogen may be required.

Varish stated that we have a SDLD Ord and we will stick to the ordinance.

There was some discussion on asking for a variance; whether the variance can be asked before the final plan is submitted.

Lloyd stated that the probes are scheduled for May 16, 2003. (Note: the probes were not done on this date due to inclement weather.

Zoning Hearing-The determination of the Zoning Hearing Board regarding Gloryridge is scheduled for May 22, 2003 stated Joyce.

The Planning Commission Board will review at least one subdivision plan on June 4, 2003; possibly two.

AC Department of Emergency Services- A letter was sent to the township regarding the complete conversion of the Municipal plan to the new format required by the Pa Emer Mgm Agency. Our plan is not in compliant with the new regulations. Joyce stated that she would contact Bill Eckert about the plan.

Comment from Supervisors-None

Comments from the public-Wayne Belt asked about the Monocacy Watershed-he stated that he understood that all township zoning ordinances are mandated to be brought up to specs regarding the watershed. Joyce stated that Dean had attended the meetings and she would inquire when our ordinance would be changed to meet the requirements. She stated that we may be somewhat behind because we recently had reviewed and rewritten parts of the Zoning Ordinance.

The Freedom Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly meeting on July 9, present at the beginning of the meeting, were Vice Chairman Samuel Brewer and Road Superintendent Ed Wenschhof Richard Varish. Secretary Joyce Shindledecker and Road Superintendent Ed Wenschhof were present. Public in attendance were Esther Langley, John Lloyd, Tom Wolf, Karen patterson and EMA Coordinator William Eckert. Beth Kanagy, Times reporter, was also present.

Samuel Brewer brought the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m.

Richard Varish made a motion to accept and approve the minutes of the June 11, 2003 meeting. Sam Brewer made a second to the motion. 2-0.

No public Comment

Road Report- Brewer read the road report submitted by Edward Wenschhof. The two-man road crew mowed along the township roadways and weed trimmed around signs and guardrails. They also cold-patched various roads as necessary. They leveled stones on Rohrbaugh and Gordon Roads. The township lot was mowed three times during the month. Ed was called up for another drug test for CDL license. The Sullivan property was checked for a new driveway. The permit was issued. The men also did various maintenance work on the township equipment. Sam reported that Ed had met with a representative from Wilson Paving to discuss the parking lot project. No date has been set to start. All the culverts have been purchased for the replacements needed on Middle Creek Road. This work will begin as Jim Bigham's schedule permits; possibly in August. Gross labor for the month of June was 1564.51. Richard Varish made a motion to accept the road report. Brewer made a second to the motion. 2-0.

Secretary Report-Joyce informed the Board that there were 193 subscribers to garbage pickup with Waste Management. This was in reference to the Board asking her to check on the numbers during the discussion at last month's meeting on burning in the township.

Joyce stated that with the submission of the proposal for an addition to the agricultural security area by SMB Associates (168.58 acres on Red Rock Road) the 45-day review process begins on July 10, 2003. This will go to the Planning Commission Board and the ASA Board in September and then forwarded to the Supervisors for a hearing in September. The hearing will be scheduled immediately before the Township Supervisors' meeting.

Monocacy Watershed Stormwater Ordinance- Joyce received a copy of the letter sent by Dean Shultz to DEP concerning the adoption of a Storm Water Management Ordinance with respect to the Monocacy River Watershed Study.

In the letter Dean advises that he is working with German, Union and Freedom Township in regards to adopting the Ordinance. He states he has attended meetings during the last six months that were held by the Watershed Alliance of Adams County and their consultants. A copy of the ordinance has recently been submitted for DEP's review. Dean states that upon comments and recommendations from DEP action will be taken to

At this time the meeting was turned over to Chairman Young who had arrived.

Mason Dixon Country Club-Mike Snyder, Tom Ladue, Duke Martin and Tom Wolf stated that they wanted to bring the Supervisors up to speed on the SDLD Plan submitted to the Planning and Supervisor Boards. The plan is a subdivision from Robert Bishop to be conveyed to MDCC of 2-three acre lots on the Bishop property. The plan calls for a pumping station to be located on the one three acre lot. The other lot is a backup in case of any future requirements of DEP for this kind of operation. The pumping station will be a public utility to the proposed 1200 homes on the MDCC site. The owners of the homes will be charged a fee for the usage. The proposed withdraw will be approximately 240,000 gallons a day. This will be a 2/3 portion of all the water needed for the development with the other 1/3 being provided by two wells on the MDCC property. A treatment plant is to be built on the former Smith property (now owned by MDCC) on Natural Dam Road. The plan shows two routes for distributing the water flow to MDCC, with the preferred rout being along Natural Dam Road. Dean Shultz SEO/Engineer advised the Supervisors of several things they would need to know before a decision to allow the waterlines along a township road, such as how close to the road, whether blasting would need to be done, who would maintain the roadway, roadwork to the berms of the road, etc.

Matt Young asked if the developer had DEP approval. Tom Wolf stated that there had been informal conversations with DEP representatives. Also the state requires that you own property that fronts where you intend to withdraw water. DEP will hold public comments. Tom Ladue also stated that Act 67 & 68 requires that proof that the proposed project is consistent with the land use in the township.

Matt Young asked that if the subdivision is granted and DEP does not allow the withdrawal what happens to the two lots. Dean stated that he would have to speak to Linus Fenicle that possibly the land would go back to the original owner.

The developers stated that they are using the low flow (of the ten year average) and only

Robert Bishop/Mason Dixon Country Club/Subdivision Plan and Land Development Plan - The Supervisors' attorney and the applicants' attorney have completed proposed conditions to the Preliminary Subdivision and Land Development Plan. The condition s will be on permanent record at the township office. Dean Shultz also presented a letter date June 9, 2004 to the Board and to the developers. The two page letter will be a part of the June 9, 2004 minutes. Richard Varish made a motion to appeare the Preliminary Subdivision and Land Development Plan (of Robert Bishop and Mason Dixon Country Club) subject to the proposed conditions on the draft letter of June 9, 2004 (of Dean Shultz) and to the conditions (completed by the solicitors) including the modified condition #15 and condition #16 (Dean's recommendations of June 9, 2004 letter). Young made a second to the motion. 2-0 Susan Smith stated that a letter of the conditions will be sent from Reager and Adler (township solicitors firm) within 5 business days to the developers. Sketch Plan Tim Shields/Yingling Farm-Joyce stated that the Planning Commission Board had received a sketch plan from Tim Shields regarding the proposed subdivision plan to include 6 lots on the Yingling Farm. The farm is currently owned by the Yinglings and is engaging in the 141st re-enactment (with the Gettysburg Anniversary Committee)on July 2-4. After the event Mr. Shields' intent is to purchase the 276 acre farm. He hopes to develop 6 estate lots. He us currently working with the Land Conservancy to obtain an easement for approx 200 acres. The next step for Mr. Shields is to have probes done on the land. In the event no perc sites are found, Mr. Shields may have to build the ground and let the lots set for a four year period. Mr. Shield's also is entertaining the idea to continue re-enactments on the farm if the Gettysburg Anniversary Board so desires.

Planning Commission Meeting-The Planning Commission voted to hold the next planning commission (if one is needed) on July 14 at 7:00 p.m. at Joyces' request. If a meeting is necessary, the advertisement will be placed in The Times for a change of meeting date.

Comments from Supervisors-Varish made a motion to pay the Planning Commission Board members 25.00 per meeting. Young made a second to the motion. Varish made a motion to have the pay retroactive to January, 2004. Young made a

Gentlemen:

We have reviewed the revised Preliminary Subdivision Plan for Robert G. Bishop and Land Development Plan for a public utility facility for Mason-Dixon Country Club, Inc.

The Plans were prepared by Dewberry and consists of Sheets T1 and Sheets C1 thru C10 with the latest revision date being May 28, 2004.

Our comments are as follows:

SHEET T1:

- It is our understanding that Attorney Linus Fenicle is preparing an agreement and conditions that will address the preliminary approval of these plans. The notes on the plan should be revised to reflect the agreement and conditions.
- 2. All certifications must be signed and notarized prior to signature of the Township
- 3. A form "B" non-building waiver module must be submitted for signatures and approval by the Township Officials and Sewage Enforcement Officer (S.E.O.). Section "C" of the waiver requires the S.E.O. to verify that all existing septic systems are not in violation of the Sewage Facilities Act. Please provide four (4) systems are not in violation of the Sewage Facilities Act. Please provide four (4) systems of Form "B" and a plan showing the location of all septic systems on the remainder of the Bishop property. If any of these facilities are in violation of the Sewage Facilities Act, I, as S.E.O., cannot sign this waiver until they are corrected.

4. We still question the way the ownership is shown on the Plans. Robert Bishop, as Owner/Subdivider, is correct, but what is Mason-Dixon County Club, Inc. shown to be. We assume Mason-Dixon would be the Equitable Owner of Lots Two (2) and Three (3) and also the Land Developer of Lots Two (2) and Three (3). Since this Plan is being submitted as a joint Subdivision Plan for Bishop and a Land Development Plan for Mason-Dixon, we recommend the purpose of the Plan be clearly defined and the certification signed accordingly.

The final sentence regarding "dedication of streets and other areas" should be deleted from the certification, as there are no areas the Township proposes to accept.
